Cambridg, Octob. 11.

**T**His day his Grace the Duke of Lauderdale, attended by the Lord Marquis of Athol, was pleased to do the University the Honour of a Visit. The Students and Graduates being placed on each side of the Regent Walk, his Grace was there met by the Vicechancellor and Doctors in their Robes, and invited up to the Regent House by the Orator in a short Address, where he was received with a solemn and elegant Speech of the same Orator, to which his Grace on the sudden returned in Latine a most polite and obliging answer. He was after that together with my Lord Marquis pleased to accept of the Degree of Doctor in the Civil Law. Then his Grace visited several other Colleges, into each of which he was introduced by an Orator; and at last he was entertained by the Vicechancellor at a noble Dinner in Trinity College.

Vienna, Octob. 4. The 29 past, his Imperial Majesty assisted at the Singing of *Te Deum* for the taking of *Philipsburg*; he has not yet declared his Marriage, which is expected every day. It is said that the Emperor has resolved to form an Army of 20000 men in *Hungary* to be employed against the Rebels, which will be commanded by General *Souches*.

Legorn, Octob. 7. Yesterday arrived here a Vessel from *Naples*, the Master says, that the 28 past, eight Spanish Gallies put in there from *Palerme* to *Caranzo* that it is thought there will be no further action on the Coast of *Sicily* this year; and the rather, for that the Dutch Rear-admiral has received order from the States to return forthwith with their Fleet to *Holland*. The Duke of *Ferdinandina*, late Viceroy of *Sicily*, is arrived at *Naples*, on his return for *Spain*. From *Rome* they write, that the Pope had remitted 50000 Crowns by Bills of Exchange to the King of *Poland*, for the carrying on more vigorously the War that Crown is engaged in against the *Turk*; That there is as yet no discourse of a promotion of Cardinals, though there be six Capvacancies; but at the next Creation, *Don Benedicto Pamphil* is sure to be one, as the Prince of *Savelli* to be declared General of the Gallies.

Rostock, Octob. 14. The 9th instant the Governor of *Demmin* capitulated, on condition that he might march out with Arms and Baggage, Drums beating, &c. and the Garrison be conducted to *Stralsund*; which conditions being granted by the Elector of *Brandenburg*, the *Holstein* Regiment was immediately admitted into the Town, yet so that the *Suedes* and *Brandenburgs* should continue in possession of their respective Posts, until the Garrison were equally marched out. The Electors Forces are ordered to go to *Stralsund* to invest that place; but the Emperors Troops are going into Winter-quarters.

Bispe, Octob. 11. The French Army, under the command of the Duke of *Luxemburg*, is at present encamped at *Zepheym*, within six hours of this place. Major General *Schultz* is posted with eight Imperial Regiments on the other side of the *Rhine* at *Wyl*, about a League and a half from hence. It seems the Duke of *Luxemburg* sent to the Duke of *Wirtemberg* to receive

a French Garrison into *Montbelliard*, to oppose the passage of the Imperialists into the *Franche Comte* by that way, but the Duke refused it, being resolved to continue Neutral, and to defend the Town with his own Soldiers. The *Suisse Cantons* begin to be very much alarmed at the near approach of the Armies towards their Territories, and have therefore resolved to hold a Council of War at *Baden*, to consider what is best to be done in the present conjuncture of affairs.

From the Imperial Camp at *Heistershym*, Oct. 11. On the 9th instant the Duke of *Lorraine* decamped from the Neighborhood of *Friburg*, and yesterday posted himself here between *Stauffen* and *Nyenbourg*; it is said he intends to fortifie this latter place, the better to block up *Brisac* on the side of *Basse*; and after to march towards *Rhinfelden*, to pass the *Rhine* there, where a great quantity of Bread is providing for the use of his Army, and the Bridge of Boats is almost finished.

Strasbourg, Octob. 12. The Marquis of *Foyense*, who was lately sent with a detachment from the Duke of *Luxemburgs* Army towards *Lorraine*, continues yet at *Ingwiller* and *Neuwiller*, without being able to pass *Lutzelsstein*, and it is thought he will be forced to return to the French Army. The Electoral Prince of *Saxony* is arrived with a Body of 1400 Horse in our Neighborhood, and continues his march towards *Basse*, to join the Duke of *Lorraine*. General *Dunewaldt* is arrived at *Offenbourg* with five Regiments from the Imperial Army, and is this day marched towards *Spire*, to join the *Lunenburg* and *Munster* Troops which are marching towards the *Saar*, and are to be commanded in chief by the Duke of *Zell*. The two Armies lie within half a League of *Basse*, the *Rhine* only between them; the Imperialists being encamped between *St George* and *Wyl*, and the French with their Artillery and Baggage, where the Duke of *Luxemburg* is in person, between *Blos* and *Isogenheim*, without any Action passing between them.

From *Limbourg*, on the 14th, Octob. 14. This day the Troops of the Duke of *Zell*, consisting in 34 Squadrons of Horse and 10 of Dragoons, will begin their march towards *Braubach* and *Lahnseyn*, and so towards the *Saar*, where they will be reinforced with 18 Squadrons of Horse under the command of General *Dunewaldt*. We are assured that those Troops, together with those of the Bishop of *Munster*, march directly towards *Deux-Ponts*, with design to take their Winter-quarters in that Neighborhood.

Cologne, Octob. 16. We have advice by an Express from *Coblenz*, that the *Lunenburg* Troops which have been for some time in the *Westerwalt*, marched 2 dayes ago towards *Braubach*, and that they intended to pass the *Rhine* at *Mantz*. The Duke of *Zell* has ordered the great Cannon he left two years ago at *Strasbourg*, to be sent to *Coblenz*, where he will take it in his passage towards the *Moselle*. The Duke of *Neembourg* will for the future make his residence at *Niembourg* on the *Danube*, and the Prince his son at *Dusseldorp*, as Stadtholder of the Dutchies of *Fuliers* and *Berghen*. The Emperor has resolved to form an Army of 24000 men in *Hungary*, to be maintained by those people, and employed solely

ly for their defence. The Rebels there are grown very considerable, and threaten to burn *Kalo*, and several other Towns, whither therefore the Emperor has sent the Count *Heberstein* with some Troops to disperse them. From *Hailbronn* they write, that on the 20 instant, an Assembly of the States of *Suabiz* is to be held there, to consider about the partition of the Winter-quarters for the Army.

*Liege, Octob. 16.* Last night a Party of the Garison of *Maastricht* came to *Herjhal*, intending to burn all the Forage in this Country, that so their Enemies might not find any subsistence for the Forces they design to send into it. Yesterday the Prisoners of that Garison which were taken at *Heers* were Ransomed at *Hasselt*, for the like number of *Hollanders*.

*Nim guen, Octob. 17.* The 14 instant arrived here the Heer *Odyke*, one of the Plenipotentiaries of this State, and having received and returned the usual Visits to the Ambassadors of *England* and *France*, is parted hence again to wait upon the Prince of *Orange* at *Soestdike*.

*Hugue, Octob. 20.* This place affords very little of moment to write at present, besides the news which the last Northern Letters bring of the Surrender of *Demmin* to the Elector of *Brandenburg*, upon which his Forces that were employed there, were ordered to march to *Stetin*, which place his Electoral Highness will endeavour to reduce by a formal Siege, if the season will permit, if not, by continuing the blocking which he hath begun. The Letters farther add, That *Anclam Veer*, a Fort near *Anclam* upon the River, the Commander of which having refused the Capitulation made by the Governot of *Anclam* stood out ever since, is at length surrendered likewise to the Elector. Upon complaint lately made to the States by a Master of a ship of *Amsterdam*, that coming from *Hamburg*, and passing by a Yacht which the Duke of *Zell* hath upon the *Swing*, the Commander of the said Yacht had required him to strike, and upon his delaying to do it, shot at him with Bullets, till he forced him to it. The States have hereupon ordered their Deputies to represent to that Dukes Minister here the consequence of this action, and, as is said, to demand satisfaction for it. Officers arrive daily from our Army which, according to our Letters from *Flanders*, is encamped near *Nostre Dame de Montaigne*. This week *Don Pedro Ronquillo* is expected here on his way to *Nimeguen*, whither the Sieur *Heugh*, one of the Danish Plenipotentiaries, is preparing to go about the middle of the next week to be present at the opening of the Assembly. The Prince of *Orange* has deferred his journey to *Zealand* to some other time. The disorders at *Rotterdam* are not yet wholly appeased. The States have received a Letter from the Town of *Embsden*, giving an account of the taking of the Castle of *Oldersum* by the Bishop of *Munsters* Troops, and putting a Garison into it, and complaining likewise of the late agreement the Princess of *Oostfrize* hath made with that Bishop, as contrary to their Laws and Priviledges, and desiring their intercession and assistance, in case they shall have need of it. The States have not yet come to any resolution upon this matter, other than that they have declared they will confer with the Ministers of their Allies about it. This week was imprisoned the Sieur *Brand* an Advocate, suspected to have murdered his Niece, after he had obliged her by Will to make him her Heir.

*Brussels, Octob. 20.* Lieutenant General *Don Francisco Marcos de V. lasco* being appointed with a detachment of 25 Troops of Horse and Dragoons to march to *Cambray*, upon notice that the *Marschal Schomberg* continues still at *Cambresis* with a

great part of his Army, is thereupon returned hither, having encamped his Troops along the *Canal* between *Labem* and *Grimberg*, till he receives further orders from his Excellency, and some farther reinforcement of Troops, those he has with him, being not, as is said, above 600 men. The Duke of *Villa Hermosa* is now at *Montaign*, which will be the last quarters his Excellency will make this Campaign, from whence the Army will soon disperse, considering the violent Rains that fall daily. It is now resolved that the *Osnaburg* Troops shall quarter in *Guelder* and this Winter, to be nearer their own Country for Recruits, and that they may hinder the frequent incursions of the Garison of *Maastricht* into that Province. On Sunday his Excellency sent for the Council of State to attend him at *Montaigne*, whether they went the next day accordingly, and are not yet returned: It is said one of the great businesses under consideration is, what measures to take for the future payment of the Army. Upon the great instances of the States of *Flanders*, there hath been lately a Conference at *Dreux*, between Monsieur *Vau* a Counsellor here, and the Intendant of *Lille*, concerning the taking off all Contributions and Confiscations on both sides betwixt *France* and these Provinces, and now upon his return, his Excellency hath sent for the Council of State to consider of that business, which is likewise very earnestly pressed by the States of this Province, and that of *Hainault*.

*Paris, Octob. 21.* The Duke of *Luxemburg* is encamped with the best part of his Army in the middle of *Switgow*, not far from *Mulhausen*, having made three great detachments, one whereof is posted within a League and half of *Basse*, under Monsieur *Bouffler*, another within three Leagues of the said City under the Count de *Roye*, and the third is gone to *Belfort*. The Duke of *Lorraine* is encamped still within a League of *Friburg*, from whence he has sent 5000 Horse towards *Mentz*, to join with the *Luxemburgs* and *Munsterians*, who are come as far as *Coblenz*. Monsieur de *Renel* has, we hope, joined the *Marschal de Crequi* with the five Battalions of the Regiments of Guard, and 15 Squadrons of Horse he was detached with from the *Marschal de Schomberg's* Army. From *Savoy* we hear that our Troops have been repulsed with some loss from before the *Scalest*, and that many of our men at *Messina* are sick, and that our Gallies are to winter there. From *Turin* they write, that the difference lately arisen between the Inhabitants of *Monterrat* and *Piedmont* is accommodated, and that accordingly the Troops of *Savoy* and *Mantua* are returned to their respective Garison, it being agreed by both Parties, that the Lands which were in dispute between them, should remain common as heretofore.
