Strasburg, Oftob. 12. The Marquis of Foyeuse, who was lately fent with a detachment from the Duke of Luxemburgs Army towards Lorrain, continues yet at Ingwiller and Meuwiller, without being able to pass Lutzelstein, and it's thought he will be forced to return to the French Army. The Electoral Prince of Saxony is arrived with a Body of 1400 Horse in our Neighborhood, and continues his march towards Balle, to join the Duke of Lorrain. General Dunewaldt is grived at Offenbourg with five Regiments from the Imperial Army, and is this day marched towards Spire, to join the Lunenburg and Munster Troops which are marching towards the saar, and are to be commanded in chief by the Duke of Zell. The two Armies lie within half a League of Bafe, the Rhine only between them; the Imperialists being encamped between Si George and Wyl, and the French with their Artillery and Baggage, where the Duke of Luxemburg is in person, between Blos and Itegentheim, without any Action passing between h.m.

Upon complaint lately made to the States by a Master of a ship of Amsterdam, that coming from Hamburg, and passing by a Yacht which the Duke of Zell hath upon the Swing, the Commander of the faid Yacht had required him to strike, and upon his delaying to do it, shot at him with Bullets, till he forced him to it. The States have hereupon ordered their Deputies to represent to that Dukes Minister here the consequence of this action, and, as is said, to demand satissaction for it. Officers arrive daily from our Arm's which, according to our Letters from Flanders, is encamped near Nostre Dame de Montaigne. Monsieur de Renel bas, we hope, joined the Marselbal de Grequi with the five Battalions of the Regiments of Guards, and 15 Squadrons of Horse he was detached with from the Mareschal de Schombergs Army. From Skily we hear that our Troops have been repulsed with some loss from before the Scalesti, and that many of our men at Messon are sick, and the Scalest 1, and that many of our men at Messia are fick, and that our Gallies are to winter there.
