AS feveral Artificers and Manufacturers, Sub-jects of Great Direct jects of Great Britain, have, from Time to Time, gone into Foreign Countries to exercife their feveral Callings, contrary to the Laws of thefe Kingdoms; The following Abstracts of Two Acts of Parliament of George the First and George the Second, to prevent fuch Practices, are published for the Information of all fuch Perfons who may be ignorant of the Penalties they may incur by Difobedience to them. - And it will be observed, that they extend to those who are any ways concerned or infirumental in the Sending or Enticing Artificers or Manufacturers out of thefe Kingdoms, and in the Exportation of the Tools and Instruments used by them, as well as to the Artificers or Manufacturers themfelves.

Statute 5 George I. Chap. 27. IF any Perfon shall contract with, entice, or folicit, any Artificer in Wool, Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, Clock-maker, Watch-maker, or any other Artificer of Great Britain, to go into Foreign Countries out of the King's Dominions, and shall be convicted thereof upon Indictment or Information, in any of the Courts at Weftminster, or at the Assistance of Quarter-Sessions, he shall be found any Sum not exceeding ONE HUNDRED POUNDS for the first Offence, and shall be imprisoned Three Months, and till the Fine be paid. And if any Per-fon having been once convict, shall offend again, he shall be fined at the Discretion of the Court, and im-

prifoned Twelve Months, and till the Fine be paid. If any of the King's Subjects, being fuch Arti-ficers, fhall go into any Country out of His Majefty's Dominions, to exercise or teach the faid Trades to Foreigners; and if any of the King's Subjects in any such Foreign Country, exercising any of the faid Trades, shall not return into this Realm within Six Months after Warning given by the Ambassador, Minister or Conful of Great Britain in the Country where fuch Artificers shall be, or by any Person authorized by such Ambassador, &c. or by one of the Secretaries of State, and from thenceforth inhabit within this Realm; fuch Perfon shall be incapable of taking any Legacy, or of being an Executor, or Administratator, and of taking any Lands, &c. within this Kingdom by Defcent, De-vife. or Purchafe; and shall forfeit all Lands, Goods. &c. within this Kingdom to His Majefty's Ule, and shall be deemed Alien, and out of His Majefty's Protection.

Upon Complaint made upon Oath before any Juffice of the Peace, that any Perlon is endeavouring to feduce any such Artificer, or that any fuch Artificer hath contracted, or is preparing to go out of his Majefty's Dominions, for the Purpoles afore-faid; fuch lottice may fend his Warrant to bring the Perfon complained of before him, or before fome other Justice : and if it thall appear by the Oath of one Witnefs, or by Confession, that he was guilty of any of the faid Offences, fuch Justice may bind him to appear at the next Affizes or Quarter Sel-fions: And if such Person shall refuse to give Secu-

rity, the Justice may commit him to Gaol till the next Affizes or Quarter Seffions, and until he shall be delivered by due Course of Law. And if any fuch Artificer shall be convict upon Indictment of any fuch Promise, Contract, or Preparation to go beyond the Seas for the Purpoles aforefaid, he shall give fuch Security to the King, not to depart out of His Majesty's Dominions, as such Court shall think reasonable, and shall be imprisoned till Security given.

If any of the above Offences shall be committed in Scotland, the fame shall be profecuted in the Court of Justiciary, or the Circuits there.

Statute 23d. George IId. Chap. 13.

IF any Perfon shall contract with, or endeavour to feduce any Artificer in Wool, Mohair, Cotton or Silk, or in Iron, Steel, Brafs, or other Metal, or any Clock maker, Watch maker, or any other Artificer in any other of the Manufactures of Great Britain or Ireland, to go out of this Kingdom or Ireland, into any foreign Country, not within the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, and shall be convicted upon Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Westminster, or by Indict-ment at the Assizes or General Gaol Delivery for the County, &c. wherein such Offence shall be committed in England, or by Indictment in the Court of Jufficiary, or any of the Circuit Courts in Scot-land; or by Indictment or Information in the King's Bench at Dublin, if such Offence be committed in Ireland; the Perfon fo convicted fhall, for every Artificer contracted with, or feduced, forfeit FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS, and shall suffer Imprisonment in the common Gaol of the Country or Stewartry wherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Twelve Calendar Months, and until Forfeiture be paid: And in Cale of a fublequent Offence of the fame Kind, the Perfons fo again offending shall forfeit, for every Perfon contracted with or feduced, ONE THOUSAND POUNDS, and thall inffer Imprifonment in the common Gaol of the County or Stewartrywherein fuch Offender shall be convicted, for Two Years, and until fuch Forfeiture be paid

If any Perfon in Great Britain or Ireland shall put on Board any Ship or Boat not bound directly to fome Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain, any fuch Tools or Utenfils as are commonly used in, or proper for the Preparing, Working up or Finith-ing of the Woollen or Silk Manufactures, or any Partof fuch Tools, he shall for every Offence forfeit all fuch Tools, or Parts thereof, put on Board, and TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered by Action of Debt, &c. in any Court of Record at Westminster, or in the Court of Session in Scotland, or at any of the Four Courts in Dublin respectively, wherein no Effoin, &c. fhall be allowed.

It shall be lawful for any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or for any Officer of the Revenue in Ireland, to feize and fecure, in fome of His Majefty's Warehoufes, all fuch Tools or Utenfils prohibited to be exported, as fuch Officer shall find on Board any Vessel not bound directly to some Port in Great Britain or Ireland, or to fome other of the Dominions of the Crown of Great Britain ; and all Tools fo feized shall, after Condemnation, be publlickly fold to the best Bidder; and one Moiety of the



the Produce shall be to the Use of His Majesty, and the other Moiety to the Officer who shall feize and fecure the fame.

If the Captain of any Veffel in Great Britain or Ireland knowingly permit any of the faid Tools, prohibited to be exported, to be put on Board his Veffel, he fhall, for every fuch Offence, forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, to be recovered as the Penalties inflicted upon Perfons exporting the Tools; and if the Veffel belongs to His Majelty, the Captain shall not only forfeit ONE HUNDRED POUNDS, but shall also forfeit his Employment, and be incapable of any Employment under His Majesty.

If any Officer of the Customs in Great Britain, or of the Revenue in Ireland, take, or knowingly fuffer to be taken, any Entry outward, or fign any Cocket or Sufferance for the Shipping or Exporting of any of the faid Tools, or knowingly fuffer the fame to be done, he shall forfeit ONE HUNDRED **POUNDS**, to be recovered as aforefaid, and alfo forfeit his Office, and be incapable of any Office under His Majesty

One Moiety of the Forfeitures shall be applied to the Use of His Majetty, and the other Moiety to the Ufe of the Perlon who shall fue for the fame.
