Warsaw, August 22.

THIS Day Sentence is to be pronounced on the Regicides; Two are condemned to lose their Heads; the Person who brought the King back to be banished the Country for ever; the others are condemned to perpetual Imprisonment. Pulawski, the Promoter and Instigator of the horrible Attack, is condemned to be hanged in Effigy, his Coat of Arms to be broken, himself declared infamous, and the Name of the Family to be changed. His Majesty's gracious Intercession in their Favour is supposed to have produced this Mitigation of the Punishment decreed by the Law for Attempts against the King's Life.

Berlin, August 28. The eldest Daughter of his Royal Highness Prince Ferdinand of Prussia departed this Life early this Morning, in the Twelfth Year of her Age.

The Harvest in this Neighbourhood has, in general, exceeded the Expectations of the Farmers; and has only failed in a few Villages, where the Crop was destroyed by the Hail which fell about Six Weeks ago.
