Price to rise here to above Fifty Shillings

and to the Levant, in Quest of Corn; and, it is said,
the Republick will ask for a Supply of Forty Thousand Salms from the King of the Two Sicilies,
and Twenty Thousand Salms from the Pope's Territories.
