Genoa, August 28.

THE Scarcity of Corn, and the scanty Harvest in Lombardy and many other other States of Italy, have occasioned the Price to rise here to above Fifty Shillings per Quarter, English, and it is feared that, as Winter approaches, the Prices will increase. Many Ships and Vessels have been sent to the Coast of Barbary, and to the Levant, in Quest of Corn; and, it is said, the Republick will ask for a Supply of Forty Thousand Salms from the King of the Two Sicilies, and Twenty Thousand Salms from the Pope's Territories.

Petersburg, August 31. This Day about Noon died here Count Peter Czernichew, elder Brother to the two Counts of that Name, and who resided many Years in England as Ambassador from this Court.

Brussels, September 17. On Tuesday last died at Antwerp, univerally regretted, Prince Maximilian de Salm Salm, Knight of the Golden Fleece, and a Lieutenant-General in the Imperial Service.

St. James's, September 24.

This Day Ibrahim Agn, Ambassador from Tripoly, had his first Private Audience of His Majesty, to deliver his Credentials.

To which he was introduced by the Right Hon. the Earl of Rochford, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assitant Master of the Ceremonies.

St. James's, September 21, 1773.
