Peterburg, September 7.

YESTERDAY being the Feast of St. Natalia, from whom her Imperial Highness the Grand Dutches took the Name of Natalia, on her professing the Greek Religion; there was a very brilliant Court in the Morning, when the Empress and their Imperial Highnesses received the Compliments of the Nobility, Foreign Ministers, and other Persons of Distinction, on the Occasion; in the Evening there was a Ball and Supper, and the Day was concluded with Illuminations, and every other Demonstration of Joy.

Stockholm, September 14. The Crop of Corn in this Country has turned out so abundant this Year, that the Price is already fallen near Fifty per Cent.

Munich, September 23. All the Corn in the Circle of Bavaria is now carried in, and the Harvest is found to be most plentiful, notwithstanding that the Field Mice have occasioned much Damage in high and dry Soils; several Expedients have been tried for their Extirpation, but none have proved effectual. There is the same Abundance of Grain in Bohemia, Franconia, and Swabia, where the Prices of all the Necessaries of Life are very considerably fallen.

St. James's, September 30.

This Day Ibrahim Agn, Ambassador from Tripoly had his First Private Audience of Her Majesty.

To which he was introduced by the Right Honourable Earl De Lawarr, Lord Chamberlain to Her Majesty, and conducted by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

Dublin, September 23, 1773.

Yesterday, being the Anniversary of Their Majesties Coronation, in the Morning the Flag was displayed on Birmingham Tower; at Noon the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks. In the Evening a Play was given by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant for the Entertainment of the Ladies; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy.
