Petersbourg, September 21.

HIS Serene Highness the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Darmstadt arrived here on Saturday last, in order to be present at the Celebration of the Marriage of his Imperial Highness the Grand Duke, which is fixed for the 10th of next Month.

Petersbourg, September 24. The unusual Dryness of the Season has been such, as to reduce the Lake Ilmen, in the Province of Great Novogorod, from an Extent of upwards of Fifty English Miles, to less than Half that Space.

Naples, September 21. On Sunday last, at a Chapter of the Knights of the Order of St. Januarius, the Prince La Rocella, and the Prince Campo Franco, the one Neapolitan, the other Sicilian, were received with the usual Ceremony.
