Edenburgh, Decemb. 11. Nine more of the Ret els are to be tived to morrow by the Court of Justice here, whereof two of them, Mr. Hugh Mackel and Mr. Alexander Robertson, Ministers. The right Arms of those that died last, are ordered to be fer up on Poles at Lanrich where they entred into Covenant, and swore their Rebellion.

Porssmouth, Decomb. 16. Yesterday came in the Francis Fregat, a new Veffel built at Harwich, which having been cruiting on the coasts of Krance, near Cape de Freste, difcovered 16 or 18 fail, which proved Hamburghers, on wards bound ; the next day he discovered fix fail to the Leewar s of him; which upon his neater approach, he made to be French Men of War. One of them by her White Flag upon the Mizzen, he judged to be the Rere-Admiral, with a part of his Squadror; a day or two after he discovered four of the sime company cruifing on the back of the Isle of Wight, but cannot hear of any prize they have yet met with.

Umbstadt, November 22. All these parts are full of joy for the Cellerion of armes, and retirement of the forces out of the Country, by whom all places have been made sufficiently sensible of the columnities of Warr, and are at present so well fatisfied with this intermission, and the great hopes that they conceive upon the Treaty at Hailbrun, that they have kept publique dairs of Rejoycing and Thanksgiving for it : in observance of the lare concluded Articles, the City of Billigheim is restored to his Electoral Highnes 5 the Castle of Hohenick, to the Baron of that place and name; Rottenberg to the Bishop of Spire, Gaversheim to Monsieur de Walbrun; Iben to Monsieur de Croneburg, and Dexheim to Monsieur de Dinheim, together with all Books, Papers, Recognizances, and other things belonging to any of the In erefled parties: The account for Arrears of Contribution, with several other disputable matters are referred to the cetermination of the Arbitrators at Hailbrun : for the fure performance of all the Articles on both fides, the Hoftages are sent to the Imperial City of Hissenberg; On the Elector Palatines part the Count de Leiningen Commander of his Cavalry, and for the Allies the Marquis de Beauveau, commander of their Cavally, who are not to flir thence, till they thall be advertised by Monfieur Frischman the French Refilent, of the full execution of the Articles. The Duke is with his whole body marched into Lorrain, confifling of 24 Troops of Horle, besides two other Troops of Light-Horsemen, and three full Regiments of Foot ; upon his de-Parture he was pleased to send a complement to his Highnels the E ector Palatine, affuring him he was ready with all his Forces to return again, whenfeever he should have occasion to req ir him, to affift him not only with his Army, but with his life

On Wednessay last the Connestable Colonna, with his Wite and Chi drenarived here, who ris faid intends to continue here during the Carnaval, and then to pais forwards towards Rome.

The Veffels intended for the Armata, are hitherto confined by unscasonable weather, which will occasion the Convoy to be much greater then was at first designed, several other Veilels laving lad time to take in their lading, and will be fitted to go in their company, some for the Armata, and others for Zante. Several foldiers are sent on board them, to reinforce the Ficer.

The last Squadron that went bence under the command of Semirecolo, have by cross winds been stopt in their Veyage,

and forced to put in at Curzola.

The Biffind Gally which his Excellency Morefini intended to have refitted for his own person, will require more time to be prepaired then he can well allot for his stay, and dis-therefore believed, he will choose rather to go aboard the new ships that are lately launched and fitted out.

Frennz, Decemb. 15. H's Imperial M jeffy upon infermation of the ear approach of the Empreis on the 27 patt, went hence with a finall Train to Newstadt, and thence to Glockning, where taking with Lim the cheif Post-Master, with other Geneiemen, Officers, and Postillions, he went forwards incognito to Schotwien, to make a visit to the Empress there, where the cheif Post Master demanding audience from the Empress for several Cavaliers; the Counts of Sprintzenstein and Kevenhaller were fi st admitted to the honor of kissing her hane; who redding, His Imperial Majesty appeared, whom the Empress discovering by the change of his countenance, sell on her kn-esto him. Whereupon Chairs being called for, they set down together, by which time, the High Chamberlain and Matter of the Horse, with a train of thirty Cavaliers, Pages, Officers, and Postillions entred, seemingly to being the news of the Emperors arrival at Schotwien ; but finding the Emperor tested near the Empreis, they pretently retired, as also did the Ladies, leaving their Imperial Majesties together about an hours space; atter which, the Emperor returned back to this City; the Empress before his departure, prefented him with a little Penage richly fet with Diamonds, to the value of 12000 Rixdollers, which the Empefrom wore from thence in his Post Har, which fell off in his return, and was the next day roken up and reflored him by a Boucker, who was richly rewarded for his pains.

The Empress being since arrived at Newstadt, has been there complemented by the Emprels Dowager, as also by the Count de Colonissch, in the behalf of the States of Lower

Austria.
