Dantzicke, Octob 16. UR Letters arrived the last Week from Poland, gave an account of some considerable Rencounters that had happened between the Poles and the Turks and Tarrars, and effeally on he 29 patt; which though it cone uded with advantage to the former, for that the lof was by much the g eater on the part of the Enemy, yet his Majesty was much troubled at the loss of several brave Polith Saldiers that were killed, besides those wounded, which were not a few. This morning we have from Letters from Leopol, which lay, that the King was encamped fo near the Enemy, that it was hourly expected they would engage in a Battel, which the Polish Soldiers (notwithstanding so much inferiour to the Turks and Tartars in number) were very eager after.

Vienna, Octob. 15. His Imperial Majelly is at prefent with the Court at Ebersdorp, from whence we have an account this mouning, that his Imperial M jelly has declared his intended Marriage with the cluef Pincess of Newburg, named Eleanora, Magdalena, Therefia, aged about 21 years; Il at the fuld Marriage will be celebrated the 15 of the next Month, being the Featt of St Leopold, (which name the Emperor bears) and that the Prince of Dietrichsteyn, High Chamberlain to his Imperial Malesty, is appointed to go and fetch the Imperial Bride, who is at prefent at the Duke her Fathers Court at Newburg. The last Letters we received from Poland speak much of the appearance there was of a sudden peace with the Turki, and that Commissioners were appointed on Both sides, who were to meet and begin the Treaty about the middle of this Month.

Ratisbunne, Octob. 17. The 12 inflant the States affembled here, had in debate the point concerning a general Peace, and the means how the special to procure the same; and it was then resolved, that the Emperory should be prayed not onely to haden his own Ambassadors, but likewise those of his Allies, to the place of Ireaty, where the Ambassadors of England, France and Holland have been already sometime. The Deputy of the Elector of Saxony, who, together with the person deputed by the Elector of Mentz, were sent to the Elector of Bavaria, to press him to join his Troops with those of the other Princes of the Empire, is returned, though, as is said, without any success in their Negotiation, that Elector pessiting in his resolution to maintain an exact Neutrality.

Copenhagen, Octob. 17. The King is expected here every day, all the Forces being at present in their Winter-quarters in Schonen, except some which are embarked, in order to the executing some design, which is kept private. The Sieur Guldentieu is suddenly expected here from Norway, in whose absence the Sieur Bauditz is to command there. So soon as the King returns hither, we shall kno v when he will give Audience to the Deputies of the Duke of Holftein, who in the name of that. Duke are to receive the investure of the Dutchy of Stefwicke. The Dutch Squidron of Men of War is returned home, though Admiral Trong continues still abroad

with several Danish Men of War. The Sieur Griffent felt has of late obtained more liberty in Prison than he had before. It is said that the Duke of Holstein Ploen, who commanded his Majesties Forces this Campagne is going for Vienna.

Hamburg, Odob. 23. Though the Elector of Branden-burg has for some time been with part of his Forces before Stetin, yet it cannot be said that that place is formally besieged, for neither the Cannon for Battery, now the I roops employed in the Siege of Demmin, are as yet come up, which mustarriv there, before they will begin to break ground; and many are even of opinion; to acconsidering how far the Witter Seven of opinion, his Electoral Highness will on ly keep the place blocked up this Winter; which opinion is confirmed by several Letters of the 20 instant from ber in. From Demmark we must not expect to hear of anymore action his year; for the Army is actually breke up, and gone into Winter-quirters.

The Deputies of the winter cantons are still assembled at Baden, though we do not hear of any sinal resolution they have taken, further than to maintain an exact Neutrality in the present War.

Strasburg, Octob. 19. The Imperial Army under the command of the Duke of Lorrain, continues encamped at Hietersheim, not far from Baste; and two days since his Highness accompanied with several principal Offi-, cers of the Army, and followed by a guard of 1000 Horse, was at Newbourg, a small place above Brisac, which, it's faid, the faid Duke means to fortifie, in order to the blocking up of Brifac this Winter. is no more discourse of the Imperialists passing the Rhine; but on the other hand, it's said, that they will about the latter end of this Month go into their Winter-quarters, in order to which, they expect the return of Count Manifelds from Vienna. The French Army commanded by the Duke of Luxemburg, continues en-, camped between Mulhausen and Enfisheym, and beset the several Passages into the Franche Comte; but the Prince of Mombellard has not yet been persuaded to receive Garisons from either side into his places, which he has manned with his own Subjects, to the number of 2000, being resolved to continue an exact Neutrality The Deputies of the Suisse Cantons continue their As fembly at Baden, and will do so, as long as the Armies are so near their Territories, that they may be able to take the refolution necessary upon any incident that may happen. It is faid that fome Imperial Parties have paffed the Rhine; the Imperialists keep still their Bridge over that River at Rhinfalds.

Liege, Odl. b. 23. Some days fince a party of Dutch Troops came from Haffelt (where is their head-quarter) to Tongres, by made no long stay there, their business being onely to fecure a number of Waggons, who came hitner from Haffelt to fetch Coals: after they were sone the French of hiaestricht came to Tougres, and threat-ned to burn the place, for failing to pay their Contributions; but at the request of several Religious, the said execution was deferred for fome days longer. Since the Dutch are come again to Tongres, though we know not whether it is with intention to remain there or not. This day arrived here a Deputy from Haffele, with a guard of 4000 Horse, who are now lodged in our Suburbs; we know not as yet the reason of their coming. The other day happened a Rencounter between a French and Spanish party near Hoye, in which several were killed on both fides.

Viissingen, Ottob. 20. The 18 instantarrived here two of the six Capers which destroyed the French Fishing Fleet at Newfoundlands having with them 3 Prizes; they parted from their Companions near the River of

Amsterdam, Octob. 26. In the Texel is arrived the Ship called the King David, being one of the Prizes taken by the Sieur Binche, from the French at St Damin go, and by it we have the confirmation that these following French Ships were taken at St Domingo, by the faid Sieur Binche: The Crowned Lille, mounted with 24 Guns, the Queen with 14 Guns, the Alcion with 18 Guns, the Hope of 6 Guns, the Florissant of 16 Guns, the Dolphin with 14 Guns, the Briftol 10 Guns, and the Fortune 12 Guns; but two of the said Ships were afterwards burnt. Most of the Men of War of this State that were employed in the Balticke this Summer are arrived in the Texel, under the command of the Vice admiral Cornelis Eversz. The Sieur Engel de Ruyter is already here in Town.

Hague, Octob. 27. This day his Highness came to Town, from his House at Sorguliet, his Guards du Corps arriving here two days before. The Regiment of Footguards is fillmt Bergen-op-Zoom, expeding farther orders. The Fifcael having been fent from hence by order of the States to Rotterdam, to seize the principal Authors of the late disorders there, on occasion of the Letting to Farm the Excize upon Wine, we are told that those Magistrates opposed at first the said Fiscael in the executing his Commission, and seemed resolved to protect their Burghers, but afterwards, upon farther consideration, permitted him to do his Office, who apprehended some of those Mutineers, the rest being fled. The Forces in Flanders are now actually separated; 16 Dutch Regiments will winter in those Provinces, besides those that have their quarters at Haffelt. We have nothing new by the last Ordinary from Germany, the Armies not having made any motion since our last; but what is most wondred at is, that the Munster and Lunenburg Troops have not yet passed the Rhine, fo that we begin to believe that they design not to enter upon any action this Campagne, but onely to provide for themselves good Winter-quarters. From Zealand we have the confirmation of the arrival of two Capersar Vliffingen, who, with the affiftance of four others, took and de-Aroyed about 20 fail of French Ships, that were fishing at Newfoundland, and afterwards landed and took the Calle of Canada.

Bruffels, Odeb. 27. All our Troops are finally sepa-

rated, and marching to their feveral Winter-quarsers? Those of the Duke of Ofnahrug are gone with a Convoy towards Guelderland, where they are to winter; but the Troops designed for Cambray, under the commint of Don Francis o Muricos de Velasco, have not been able to get farther than Va enciennes, for that the French are so posted about Cambray, that there is no postsibility of getting into the place; the French stem to hive a design to block it up this Winter, that the taking of it may be the more easie the next Campigne; and as we hear they intend to do the like with St Omer. We are affured that the Duke de Villa Hermofa parted this morning from his quarters at Mortaigne, on his way to Animerp, from whence his Excellency is expected in a day or two. Mareschal d' Humieres bas sent a considerable Body of Mea to Lessines, which they are fortifying, and when that is done, wil, it's faid, do the like to the Caltle of Leikerke and Aloft. This afternoon arrived here his Excellency the Lord Berkley, Am bissador Extraordinary of His Majesty of Great Britain, on his way to Nimeguen, having been received with all imaginable honors and respects. We have advice that the Lunenburg and Munster Troops have passed the Rhine at Coblenty.

Paris, OBob. 28. We have not at present any thing new from abroad, our last Letters from Assactelling us, that the Duke of Luxemburg continued encamped near Mulbaus n, and the Imperial Army between Basse and Bribarg, on the other side of the Rbine. In the mean time preparations are making here against Spring, and, as we are told, Commissions have not been onely given out for the recruiting the Regiments already on foot, but likewise for the raising of new. The Elector of Bawara, we hear, continues sirm in his Neutralit, and to the Deputies that were sent to him from the Electoral Colleage assembled at Raisinome answered, that he would not be wanting in any thing on his part which might contribute to the procuring a general Peace.
