Constantinople, September 17.

BY Letters from Aleppo we are informed, that the Plague had carried off two hundred and fifty thousand of the Inhabitants of Bagdat, and one hundred and forty thousand at Busfora; that the People of Orfa are again in Arms, and have driven out of the Town the Mutelem in the Absence of the Pacha, who is at Hama.

St. Pierrebourg, October 5. On Sunday last, the Anniversary of her Imperial Majesty's Coronation, she was pleased to testify to his Excellency Count Panin the just Sense she entertained of the Manner in which he had acquired himself of the Trust hitherto committed to him of Governor of the Great Duke, by bestowing on him an Estate for Ever, of the yearly Value of 30,000 Roubles, giving him also a Pension of 30,000 Roubles, besides an Appointment of 14,000 Roubles, as Chief of the Department of Foreign Affairs; to which was added the Choice of any House in Peterfbourg to be purchased for him, with 100,000 Roubles to furnish it; 50,000 Roubles for a Service of Plate, the Equipage and Celiar of the Court for a Twelvemonth. At the same Time all the Officers of the Great Duke's Household were dismissed with Pensions of 2,000 Roubles, and a Present of 6,000 Roubles each. His Imperial Highness is to be served for the Future by the Officers of the Empress's Household.

Her Imperial Majesty was likewise pleased to raise Count Zachar Czernichew to the Rank of Field-Marshal, and to give him a Starosty in White Russia, of the yearly Value of between fifteen and Twenty Thousand Roubles.

Count Woronzow, formerly Minister in England, was made President of the College of Commerce; and several other Promotions took Place.

Munich, October 17. A severe Edict has just been published against Duels, which are strictly prohibited under Pain of Death; and this is extended to Seconds and other Assitants.

St. James's, October 30.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Richard Crabb, of London, Esq; and Henry Crabb, his only Son, and to their Issue, His Royal Licence and Authority to assume the Name of Boulton, in Compliance with the Will of Richard Boulton, late of the Parish of St. Olave Hart-Street in the City of London, Esq; deceased; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His College of Arms.
