The Marriage Ceremony of the Countels D'Artois was performed on Sunday last at Moncalier, and on Monday her Royal Highness fet out for France, and is expected to arrive at Pont Beauvoisin on the 4th of next Month, where the Equipages of his most Christian Majesty are to meether. Their Sardinian Majesties, the Prince of Pied. mont, and the Duke of Chablais, accompanied her Royal Highness the first Day's Journey, and re-turned to Montcalier Yesterday. Her Royal Highness is attended by the Counters Favria and the Countels de la Villa, as Ladies of the Bedchamber; the Countess Duing and the Marquise Cinzan; the Count de la Frinité; as Steward of the Houshold; the Chevalier Cinzan, Count Piofasco, and Count Fresia Radicati as Gentlemen of the Bedchamber; and the Abbé Solar as Chaplain. In Confequence of thele Nuptials there was a Concert, and a very magnificent Ball at Stupaniggi. The Illuminations of the Palace were disposed so as to correspond with the Architecture; and the Road from Stupanis to Turin was illuminated, and decorated with feveral Triumphal Arches, the Whole making a most brilliant Appearance.

London, November 9.

Yesterday Frederick Bull, Esq; Lord Mayor Elect for the Year enfuing, was fwotn at Guildhall; when the Chair, and other Enfigns of Mayoralty, were furrendered to him in the accustomed Manner.
