HERE are now fome Hopes of Rain, of which there has fcarcely been a Drop in this Part of the Country for these four Months past. Turin, October 27. The Marriage Ceremony of the Countels D'Artois was performed on Sunday laft at Moncalier, and on Monday her Royal Highness fet out for France, and is expected to arrive at Pont Beauvoifin on the 4th of next Month, where the Equipages of his most Christian Majesty are to meet her: Their Sardinian Majesties, the Prince of Pied. mont, and the Duke of Chablais, accompanied her Royal Highness the first Day's Journey, and re-turned to Montcalier Vesterday. Her Royal Highnefs is attended by the Counters Favria and the Countels de la Villa, as Ladies of the Bedchamber ; the Counters Duing and the Marquife Cinzan; the Count de la Prinité, as Steward of the Houthold; the Chevalier Cinzan, Count Piofafco, and Count Frefia Radicati as Gentlemen of the Bedchamber; and the Abbé Solar as Chaplain. In Confequence of these Nuptials there was a Concert, and a very magnificent Ball at Stupaniggi. The Illuminations of the Palace were difpoled fo as to correspond with the Architecture; and the Road from Stupanis to Turin was illuminated, and decorated with feveral Triumphal Arches, the Whole making a most brilliant Appearance.

## London, November 9.

Yesterday Frederick Bull, Esq; Lord Mayor Elect for the Year enfuing, was swotn at Guildhall; when the Chair, and other Ensigns of Mayoralty, were furrendered to him in the accustomed Manner.

And this Day the new Lord Mayor, accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, feveral of the Aldermen, and the Sherins, in their Scarlet Gowns, went in their Coaches to the Water-fide, the Sword and Mace being carried before them, and the City Officers attending, and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the Companies in their respective Barges, adorned with Streamers and Pen-dants, to Wellminster; and having walked round the Hall, and felemnly faluted all the Courts, they went to the Exchequer Bar, and the new Lord Mayor did there take the Oaths appointed; and having recorded Warrants of Attorney in the proper Courts, returned by Water to Black Fryars, and from thence in Coaches, with the ufual Solemnity, to Guildhall, where a magnificent Entertainment was provided ; at which were prefert divers of the Nobility, and Lords of His Majefty's most Honorable Privy Council, and many other Perfons of Quality and Diftinction.
