Naples, October 12. Certain Accounts have been received of the Arrival of the Marquis Fogliani at Messina, on the 26th of September. His Excellency on his first Arrival in that City lodged at a Convent in the Suburbs, but was to make his Publick Entry as Vice-Roy on the 29th, having issued his Proclamation on the 27th for the Courts of Judicature to repair to Messina.

Petersburg, October 19. The Hereditary Prince of Hesse Darmstadt has just entered into this Service with the Rank of Brigadier-General. The Departure of the Landgravine and the two Princesses her Daughters is fixed for Thursday next.

On Sunday last a very magnificent Masquerade was given at the Palace to the Nobility; and Tomorrow there is to be a general Masquerade at the same Place. To-night there is to be a Variety of Entertainments at the Court-Theatre.

Dublin, November 6.

Thursday last, being the Anniversary of the Birth of the late King William the Third of glorious Memory, in the Morning the Flag was dis-

played on Birmingham Tower; at Noon there was a splendid Appearance of the Nobility and other Persons of Distinction at the Castle, to compliment his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant; after which his Excellency, attended by the Nobility and Gentry, and escorted by a Squadron of Horse, went in Procession round the Statue of King William, the Regiments on Dublin Duty lined the Statue on each Side; and, after his Excellency's Return to the Castle, the Great Guns at the Salute Battery in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn up on College-Green; and the Night concluded with Bonfires, Illuminations, and all other Demonstrations of Joy. And Yesterday, being the Anniversary of the horrid Gunpowder Plot, the Great Guns in His Majesty's Park the Phoenix were fired three Rounds, and answered by Volleys from the Regiments in Garrison, which were drawn out in the Royal Square at the Barracks; and the Evening concluded with Illuminations, Bonfires, and other Demonstrations of Joy.
