

from *Saverne* towards the *Saar*, with 2000 Men under his command, had a Rencounter with much about the same number of Imperialists of the Garisons of *Keyserlautern* and *Schonecke*, in which the latter are said to have had the Advantage, and that of the French there were near 300 killed upon the place. The Imperial Army does not as yet move out of its quarters between *Friburg* and *Rhinfeldr*, and though we cannot at present see any likelihood of action, yet it's said that they will not go into their Winter-quarters, till towards the latter end of the next Month.

*Cologne, Octob. 27.* We have Letters dated yesterday at *Coblentz*, which advise, that the Duke of *Zell* arriv'd there, to visit their Elector, but parted again in the evening to join his Forces, which had pass'd the *Rhine* the day before. Our Letters from *Mentz* say, that onely 6000 of the *Lunenburg* and *Munster* Troops had pass'd the *Rhine*, and that the rest, being about 4000 more, remained on the other side with the Baggage.

*Hague, Octob. 30.* The 26 instant his Highness the Prince of *Orange* arriv'd here, from his house at *Sorgvliet*, and the next day his new *Suisse* Guard, consisting in 50 Men, appear'd for the first time very richly clothed in his Highnesses Livery. Yesterday the Deputies of the States for secret affairs had a Conference with his Highness, and it's said, their consultations were concerning a Peace, which all sorts of people here seem extremely to wish. Monsieur *Odyke* is preparing for his journey to *Nimeguen*, from whence they write, that the English and French Ambassadors had been abroad to view certain places which might be agreed on for the settling the Neutrality about that place. It is said here that the *Lunenburg* and *Munster* Troops, who have pass'd the *Rhine*, will go and attack *Doux-Pontz*, being assist'd by the Imperial Detachment under *Dunewalt*, and some other Troops of the Electors of *Mentz* and *Treves*; and that done, they will go into their Winter-quarters. The Duke of *Lorraine* has not yet pass'd the *Rhine*, though he still keeps a Bridge over that River near *Rhinfeldr*.

*Brussels, Octob. 30.* This morning his Excellency my Lord *Berkley* parted hence for *Nimeguen*, by the way of *Antwerp*, having been received here and in all the Spanish Territory, with great honors and respects; and this evening the Duke de *Villa Hermosa* is arriv'd here, all our Troops being now actually in their Winter-quarters, except those design'd for *Cambray*, who can get no farther than *Valenciennes*, because the French Troops continue in the Neighborhood of *Cambray*, with intention to hinder the putting any supply of Provisions or Men into the place this Winter. This afternoon we had an alarm that a Body of French Horse was come near this place, upon which, his Excellencies Guards that were here, were immediately ordered to march out, to learn a farther account of the Enemy. On Friday last the Bishop of *Osnaabrugh* march'd with his Forces towards *Guelderland*, where it was said they were to winter, but that is contradicted again; and now it is reported, that the said Duke will march on farther as some think towards the *Rhine*. The Duke de *Montalto*, General of the Cavalry, who has been very ill, is now pretty well recovered again. From *Ghent* they write, that upon the advice they had that a French party from *Audenarde* was marching with design to make another incursion into the Country of *Waes*, greatest part of that Garison went out, and rencountering with the said French party, had a sharp dispute with them;

which ended to the disadvantage of the French, of whom several were killed, and about 30 taken Prisoners, who were brought to *Ghent*. It is onely part of the *Munster* and *Lunenburg* Forces have pass'd the *Rhine*; and our Letters from *Cologne* and it's else parts bid us not to expect any great matter from them this Campaign, for that they begin to talk of Winter-quarters. The Emperor has certainly declar'd his Marriage with the Princess of *Neuburg*, and has sent to complement that Princess thereupon; but the last Letters from *Vienna* said, that the Marriage would not be consumm'd till the 5th of *January*, which is the future Emperesse her birth day.

*Paris, Octob. 31.* Our last advices from the Duke of *Lunenburg's* Camp said, That their Infantry was encamp'd along the *Rhine* between *B. Isaac* and *Basle*, and that the Cavalry was quarter'd in the *Upper Alsace*; That the Imperial Army, under the command of the Duke of *Lorraine*, was encamp'd on the other side of the *Rhine* between *Friburg* and *Rhinfeldr*; That the Troops of the Circles, which after the taking of *Philippburg*, join'd the Imperial Army, were march'd towards *Swabia* and *Franconia*, in order to their going into Winter-quarters, which it's believ'd the Imperialists will likewise do very suddenly, expecting onely the return of Count *Mansfeld* from *Vienna*, with the Emperors orders concerning the partition of the said quarters. From *Mentz* they write, that the *Marschal de Craqui* was at *Saint Avau*, and that his Troops march on the *Sarre*, to observe the motion of the Confederate Troops, under the command of the Duke of *Zell*, who is preparing to pass the *Rhine* near *Coblentz*. From *Sicily* we have an account, that the Duke de *Vivonne* had taken a small place called *Melidib*, and after pillaging it, had quitted it again, and that he intend'd to attack *Leopoldine* and *Carlentine*, in order to the freighting of *Strause*. *Marschal Schomberg* has left the Army in *Flanders*, and is in few days expect'd at Court. The 17 instant the *Sieur Quillerot* Envoy Extraordinary from the King of *Sweden*, had his Audience of Leave of their Majesties in order to his return home. The King we hear has given the Government of *Brisic* to Monsieur *Faylaet* Governour of *Philippburg*, and the *Sieur le Roy*, who is at present there, is to go and command at *Metz*. The Feast of *S. Huberts* will not be celebrated at *Villers Coudres*, as was intended, for that the Small Pox is very common there, but will be kept at *Verailles*. The *Suiffers* are absolutely resolv'd to oppose the Imperialists with Force, in case they attempt to pass the *Rhine* within their Territories.
