Celogne, Offob. 27. We have Letters dated yester-day at Cublenty, which advise, that the Dake of Zell carrived the 24, to visit their Elector, but parted again in the evening to join his Forces, which had paffed the Rhine the day before. Our Letters from Ment? fay, that onely 6000 of the Lunenburg and Munfter Troops had passed the Rhine, and that the rest, being about 4000 more, remained on the other fide with the Bag-

gage, Hague, Oftob. 30. The 26 inflant his Highness the Prince of Orange arrived here, from his house at Sorgvillet, and the next day his new Suisse Guard, consisting in 50 Men, appeared for the first time very richly clothed in his Highneffes Livery. Yesterday the Deputies of the States for lecret affairs had a Conference with his Highnes, and, it's faid, their consultations were concerning a Peace, which all forts of people here feem extremely to wish. Monsieur Odyke is preparing for his journey to Nimeguen, from whence they write, that the English and French Ambassadors had been abroad to view certain places which might be agreed on for the fetling the Neutrality about that place. It is faid here that the Lunenburg and Munster Troops, who have passed the Rhine, will go and attack Doux-Pontes being affilted by the Imperial Detachement under Dunewalt, and fome other Troops of the Electors of Menta and Treves; and that done, they will go into their Winter-quarters. The Duke of Lorrain has not yet passed the Rhine, though he still keeps a Bridge over that River near Rhinfeldt.

Bruffels, Octob. 36. This morning his Excellency my Lord Berkley parted hence for Nimeguen, by the way of Antwerp, having been received here and in all the Spanish Territory, with great honors and respects; and this evening the Duke de Villa Hermofa is arrived here, all our Troops being now actually in their Winter-quarters, except those designed for Cambray, who can get no farther than Valenciennes, because the French Troops continue in the Neighborhood of Cambray, with intention to hinder the putting any supply of Provisions or Men into the place this Winter. This afternoon we had an alarum that a Body of French Horse was come near this place, upon which, his Excellencies Guards that were here, were immediately ordered co marchour, to learn a farther account of the Enemy. On Friday last the Bishop of Osnabrugh marched with his Forces towards Guelderland, where it was faid they were to winter, but that is contradicted again; and now it is reported, that the faid Duke will march on farther as some think, towards the Rhine. The Duke de Montalto, General of the Cavalry, who has been very ill, is now pretty well recovered again. From Ghent they write, that upon the advice they had that a French party from Audenarde was marching with defign to make another incursion into the Countrey of Waes, greatest part of that Garison went out, and rencountring with

which ended to the disadvantage of the French, of whom feveral were killed, and about 30 taken Prifeners, who were brought to Ghent. It items onely part of the Munster and Lunenburg Forces have pased the Rhine; and our Letters from Cologne and it ofe parts bid us not to expect any great matter from them this Campagne, for that they begin to talk of Winter-quarters. The Emperor has certainly declared his Marriage with the Princess of Neuburg, and has sent to complement that Princess thereupon; but the last Letters from Vienna faid, that the Marriage would not be confummated till the 6th of Fanuary, which is the future Empresse her

Paris, Octob. 31. Cur last advices from the Duke of Lux-emburgs Camp said, That their susantity was encamped along the Rhine between B. is and Base, and that the Cavalry was quartered in the Upper Alsace; That the Imperial Army, un-der the command of the Duke of Lorrain, was encamped on the other fide of the Rhine between Fribnog and Rhinfeldt; That the Troops of the Circles, which after the taking of Philips-burg, joined the Imperial Army, were marched towards Suchia and Franconia, in order to their going into Winter-quatters, which, it's believed the Imperialitis will likewife do very suddenly, expecting onely the return of Count Mansfels from Vienna, with the Emperors orders concerning the partition of the said quarters. From Meiz they write, that the Mareschal de Crequi was at Sains Avau, and that his Troops march on the Sarre, was at dain caran, and that his Loops material and opinion to observe the motion of the Confederate Troops, under the command of the Duke of Zell, who is preparing to pass the Rhine near Coblents. From Sicily we have an account, that the Duke de Vivonne had taken a small place called Melidia, and af-Duke at Fromme had taken a intelligence caucit Methad, and atter pillaging it, had quitted it again, and that he intended to attack Leotime and Carlentine, in order to the fireighting of Stracufa Marefchal Schomberg has left the Army in Floriders, and is in few days expect d at Court. The 17 inftant the Sieure Carlette for the Ning of Strate had Guilleret Enyoy Extraordinary from the King of Suiden, had his Audience of Leave of their Majesties in order to his return home. The King we hear has given the Government of Bri-fieto Monsteur Fay late Governor of Philipphung, and the Sieus le Roy, who is at present there; is to go and command at Merz. The Feast of S: Huberts will not be celebrated at Villers Coireis, as was intended, for that the Small Pox is very common there, but will be kept at Versaules. The Suissers are absolutely re-solved to oppose the Imperialists with Force, in case they are tempt to pals the Rhine within their Territories.
