**O** Stockholm, November 30. On Wednesday last the Marriage of his Royal Highness Prince Charles of Sweden with the Princess of Holstein Gottorp was notified by the President of the Chancery to the Foreign Ministers, who had, on the Day following, separate Audiences of their Majesties, and the Royal Family; after which there was a numerous Court, and their Majesties, and the whole Royal Family, dined in Publick.

Berlin, December 7. The Landgravine of Hesse Darmstadt, attended by the two Princesses her Daughters, arrived here on Sunday last the 5th Instant. They dined that Day with her Royal Highness the Princess Amelia, and supped with the Princess Dowager of Prussia. Yesterday they were entertained magnificently by Prince Henry; To-day they return to Potzdam.

Hamburg, December 10. Last Tuesday in the Forenoon his Serene Highness the Duke of Holstein Gottorp, Bishop of Lubeck, arrived here with his Son the Prince Co-adjutor of that Bishopruck; the next Day the Senate of this City sent a Deputation to compliment their Serene Highnesses on their Arrival; and the Foreign Ministers had the Honour to pay their Court to their Serene Highnesses, and were very graciously received. On Thursday their Serene Highnesses set out for Oldenbourg, where, after the Act of Cession of the Counties of Oldenbourg and Delmenhorst is made on the Part of Denmark to Monsieur de Saldern in the Name of the Grand Duke of Ruffia, his Serene Highness the Bishop will take Possession of them, and receive the Oath of Allegiance in his own Name from the Inhabitants.

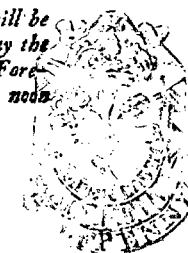
