Peterfourg, December 14.

HE Weather has been to mild for fome Days pail, that the Port of Cronitadt is opened again, and a Ship failed from thence Yeflerday, an Inftance of which is not remembered at this Time of the Year.

Berlin, December 25. His Pruffian Majefty, ac-companied by Prince Frederick of Brunfwick and General Lentulus, came hither on Wednefday last from Potzdam, and the fame Day his Majesty gave Audience to the Foreign Ministers. The Queen of Pruffia recovers daily from her late Indifpolition, but is not yet well enough to partake of the Amufements of the Carnaval which are now begun, and will last as long as his Pruffian Majesty stays in Berlin

Vienna, December 25. Their Imperial Majeflies received this Day, from Florence, the agreeable News that the Grand Dutchefs is happily delivered of a Prince.

Oftend, December 29. The Diftemper amongs the horned Cattle is again broken out in several Parts of the Province called Weft Flanders ; a few Districts of which (viz. Courtray, Furnes, Bruges, and Ipres) annually supply their Neighbours with fixty or jeventy thousand Head of Black Cattle, of which Lide alone confumes twelve or fourteen Thousand. In the District of Courtray several infected Cattle have been already killed ; and this Week the Diffemper has appeared at Sevecote and St. Peter's Capelle, two Villages not above two Leagues from this Town, where fix infected Beafts have been killed; notwithstanding which, and the unremitting Attention of the Perfons appointed in the Beginning of last Year to superintend every Thing relative to this Contagion, it is appre-hended from the defultory Manner of its appearing at Flaces remote from each other, that it may again become general in this Province.

The Military Cordon, established on this Frontier towards French Flanders on the breaking out of the former Contagion, has not been removed, fo that there is no Reafon to think that it has been intr dated by Infection; it feems rather to proceed from the Influence of the Air, and the Quantity of Rain, with which these low Pasture-Grounds have been overflowed for these last three Months.

Bruffells, January 4. The Magistrates of Bruffells, having received Information that the Di-The Magistrates of Brufftemper amongst the horned Cattle threatened different Places of the Low Countries, and particularly that in the Town of Ninove there was a Stall infected with it, have isfued an Ordinance to forbid the Introduction of any Cattle into this Town, aud it's Jurisdiction, unless the Concuctors of them shall produce good Certificates of Health, together with a Declaration from whence the Carthe come : and it is particularly forbidden to bring into this Town, and it's Jurifdiction, any Cattle coming from Ninove, or from any Place within one League of that Town; and that all Cattle brought into this Town, and it's Jurifdiction, contrary to the faid Ordinance, shall be killed, and buried immediately, and those who bring them punished.

St. James's, January 8. His Majesty has been pleased to prefent Henry Chaytor Clerk, Doctor of Laws, to the Vicarage of Catterick in the County of York and Diocefe of Chefter, void by the Refignation of Theophilus Lindíay, A. M. the last incumbent.

IT Hereas by an Act paffed in the luft Seffion of Parliament, Money was granted for paying a Bounty for the Year 1773, of Two Shillings and Six Pence a Day to Fifteen Chaplains, and Two Shillings and Sixtence a Dayto Fifteen Chaplains, and Two Shillings a Day to Fifteen more Chaplains, who have ferwed longeft on board His Majefty's Ships of War; provided it appears, by the Books of the faid Ships, that they have been actually horne and muftered thereon for the Space of Four Years during the late War with France and Spain; and pro-wided likewife, that fuch Chaplains do not enjoy the Benefit of Jome Ecclefisftical Liwing or Preferment, from the Crown or otherwife, of the prefent annual Veloc of Fish Demodes

Value of Fifty Pounds: The Principal Officers and Commiffioners of His Majesty's Navy give Notice to all fuch Chaptains as are within the aforefaid Description, that they are forthwith to apply to this Office to be admitted to the faid Bounty; and at the fame Time to deliver a Lift of the Ships they have ferved in, together with an Affidavit made before a proper Magistrate, that they have not enjoyed the Benefit of any Ecclefiastical Living or Preferment, from the Crown or otherwise, of the prefert annual Value of Fifty Pounds, between the 1st of January and 31st of December, 1773, in order that Liss may be made out for the Payment of the aforefaid Bounty.
