Pe:ersburg, December 28. HE Infurrection of the Coffacks in the Province of Oremburg, which it was thought would have been quelled without much Difficulty, has gathered fo much Strength, that it has been found necessary to order several Regiments to march into that Province; and by the last Accounts it appears that the Inforgents were not yet dispersed.

Hamburg, January 7. M. de Hecht, the Prussian Minister here, has notified to the College of Commerce, that his Prussian Majesty had thought proper to aboish the Duties of Twelve and an Half per Cent. hitherto paid at Berlin on the Transit of Sugars, and all other Merchandize, passing through that City to Silesia.

Hamburg, January 14. It has frozen so hard these two or three Days past, that People pass in Sledges over the Elbe to Harburg. We are without any Mails from nost Parts of the Empire, as well as from Poland, Sweden, and Denmark, for these two Poss: Neither are those, due Today from England and Holland, expected to arrive before
