Petersburg, December 28.

THE Insurrection of the Cossacks in the Province of Oremburg, which it was thought would have been quelled without much Difficulty, has gathered so much Strength, that it has been found necessary to order several Regiments to march into that Province; and by the last Accounts it appears that the Insurgents were not yet dispersed.

Hamburg, January 7. M. de Hecht, the Prussian Minister here, has notified to the College of Commerce, that his Prussian Majesty had thought proper to abolish the Duties of Twelve and an Half per Cent. hitherto paid at Berlin on the Transit of Sugars, and all other Merchandize, passing through that City to Silesia.

Hamburg, January 14. It has frozen so hard these two or three Days past, that People pass in Sledges over the Elbe to Harburg. We are without any Mails from most Parts of the Empire, as well as from Poland, Sweden, and Denmark, for these two Posts: Neither are those, due Today from England and Holland, expected to arrive before Tomorrow.

Ostend, January 19. The Distemper among the Horned Cattle, and the Slaughter of the Infected, still continue, in different Parts of this Province and Neighbourhood; and to this Mode of Prevention the Committee hitherto seem resolved to adhere.

THE Post-boy who was robbed of the Mail from London, of the 21st of December, was again robbed at Eleven o'Clock on Friday Night last, near Causton, two Miles North of Stamford, of the Mail of Thursday Night, from this Office, by the same Person, as he verily believes, who robbed him before, and who opened the following Bags, viz. Lincoln, Hull, Grantham, Newcastle, Belford, Morpeth, Alnwick, Berwick, and the Bye Bag, with the Letters from Causton, for the North, and took something out of one of them, but he does not know which, and then put the Mail upon the Cart, not suffering the Boy to alight.

The Person is now described to be middle-aged, rather more than Five Feet high, of a pale Complexion, weak Voice, dark short brown or black Hair, rather bulky, was dressed in a blue Great Coat, with two Rows of white Buttons, had on a round bound Hat, with a black Crape round it, and dirty Leather Breeches.

Whoever shall apprehend and convict, or cause to be apprehended and convicted, the Person who committed this Robbery, will be intitled to a Reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS, over and above the Reward given by Act of Parliament for apprehending Highwaymen; or if any Person, whether an Accomplish in the Robbery or knowing thereof, shall make Discovery whereby the Person who committed the same
