Florence, January 1.

THIS being New Year's Day, and one of the three Galas reserved, Notice was sent by the Great Chamberlain to the Foreign Ministers, that the Great Duke would receive them at Noon, and that his Royal Highness would afterwards dine in publick, at which Ceremony they always attend. His Royal Highness went in great State, according to Custom, to the Cathedral Church; after which all the Classes of the Nobility and the Military Officers kissed his Hand.

Warsaw, January 5. Accounts are received from Marshal Romanzow, that all the Russian Troops are now returned to this Side of the Danube, except three Posts maintained on the other Side; that the Marshal has fixed his Head Quarters at Yaffi; and that the Campaign, for this Season, is entirely at an End.
