Dresden, January 12.

THE late heavy Fall of Snow having been succeeded by a severe Frost, the Navigation of the Elbe is entirely stopt; but it is thought it will prove beneficial to the Land in this Part of Germany. Many Provinces of this Electorate have for several Months been over-run with such Numbers of Field-Mice, that all the Methods made use of to destroy them have hitherto proved ineffectual; it is hoped, however, that this great Quantity of Snow, when it melts, will drown them, and prevent any farther Damage from these Vermin.

Berlin, January 18. To-Day, being the Birth-Day of Prince Henry of Prussia, his Royal Highness had a numerous Levée at his Palace this Morning; and in the Evening there will be a Ridotto and Masquerade, at which his Prussian Majesty will be present.

The Queen of Prussia still continues very ill and confined to her Apartment.
