HIS Day His Majesty came to the House of Peers, and being in His Royal Robes feated on the Throne with the usual Solemnity, Sir Francis Molyneux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, was fent with a Meffage from His Majefty to the Houfe of Commons, commanding their Attendance in the House of Peers: The Commons being come thither accordingly, His Majesty was pleased to give the Royal Assent to

An Act for continuing, and granting to His Majefly, certain Duties upon Malt, Mum, Cyder, and Perry, for the Service of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-four.

An Act for granting an Aid to His Majefly, by a Land Tax to be raifed in Great Britain, for the Ser-wice of the Year One Thousand Seven Hundred and Seventy-four.

An Act for punishing Mutiny and Defertion; and for the better Payment of the Army and their Quarters.

An Act for granting Annuities, in the Manner there-in provided, to fuch Perfons as fall voluntarily fubscribe towards the raising a Sum not exceeding the Sum of Two Hundred and Sixty five Thousand Pounds.

WE your Majefly's most dutiful and loyal Subjects the Commons of Ireland in Parliament affembled, being highly fenfible of the ineftimable Bleffings we enjoy under your Ma-jefty's mild and aufpicious Reign; and defirous to the utmost of cur Power to support your Majefty's Government with Honour, do moft hum-bly befeech your Majefty, that as a further Sup-ply to your Majefty, a Sum, not exceeding Two Hundred and Sixty-five Thousand Pounds, shall be railed by granting Life Annuities, or Intereft, at the Rate of Six Pounds per Annum, with Benefit of Survivorship: And for that Purpole, Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majefty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons in this prefent Parliament affembled, and by the Autho-rity of the fame. That if any Perfon or Perfons, your Majefly's natural born Subjects or Foreigners, fhall, within the feveral Times, and in Manner herein after particularly mentioned, pay into His Majefty's Treasury in Ireland, any Sum or Sums of Money, not exceeding in the Whole, the faid Sum of Two Hundred and Sixty-five Thoufand

Pounds, to be fubscribed by them in Sums of One Hundred Pounds each, there shall be paid to fuch Perfon or Perfons fo paying and advancing the fame refpectively, their Executors, Administrators, or Affigns, or to the Person or Persons le-gally authorized by them to receive the fame, by the Hands of the Vice-Treasurer or Vice-Treafurers, Pay-maîter or Receiver-General, his or their Deputy or Deputies, Annuities of Six Pounds per Annum, for each and every Hundred Pounds fo fubfcribed and paid, for and during the Lives of the Perfons to be nominated by the Perfons fubfcribing and paying the faid Sum and Sums refpectively, together with fuch additional Interest as shall accrue by Survivorship, in Man-ner herein after provided; and that the faid Annuities shall commence from the Twenty-fifth Day of December One thousand feven hundred and feventy-three, and shall be paid Half Yearly in equal Portions, on every Twenty-fourth, Day of June, and Twenty-fifth Day of December, in every Year.

And be it enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That a Sum of Twenty Pounds, Part of each One Hundred Pounds, fo to be fubscribed, shall be paid into the faid Treafury on or before the First Day of March, in the Year One thousand seven hundred and feventy-four; and that a further Sum of Forty Pounds per Cent. thereof be paid on or before the First Day of June, in the Year One thousand feven hundred and feventy-four; and that the remaining Sum of Forty Pounds per Cent. to compleat the Payment of every such Subscription of One Hundred Pounds, be paid on or before the Twentyfourth Day of July, in the Year One thousand feven hundred and feventy-four; at or before which last mentioned Time, all and every Perfon and Perfons having compleated the Payment of the Sum or Sums by him, her, or them, fubscribed respectively, shall name fuch Perfon or Perfons as he, fhe, or they fhall think proper, to be the Person or Persons for and during whose Life or Lives the faid Annuity or Annuities, with the faid Benefit of Survivorship, shall be refpectively paid; and that every Subscriber may subscribe and pay as many Sums of One Hundred Pounds each as he or fhe shall think fit; and that all and every Perfon and Perfons fubfcribing and paying as aforefaid, may name to the Vice-Treasurer or Vice-Treasurers, Pay-master, or Receiver-General, his or their Deputy or Deputies for the Time being, one or more Life or Lives, at his, her or their Difcretion, for the Sum or Sums by him, her, of them fubscribed and paid, so as no more Lives than one be named for each diffinct Sum of One Hundred Pounds, fo fubscribed and paid; and levery Perfon fo fubscribing and paying, or their Executors, Ad-ministrators, or Affigns, shall receive such Annuity or Intereft as aforefaid, together with fuch Benefit of Survivorship as is herein after provided, for every Hundred Pounds subscribed and paid as aforesaid during the Life fo named, for every fuch Sum of One Hundred Pounds respectively; and that every fuch Subscriber may name one and the same Life for fo many of fuch feveral and diffinct Sums of One Hundred Pounds each, fo fubfcribed and pate as fuch Subscriber shall think fit; and that the feve ral Nominees in the faid Life-Annuities shall be de
