Conflantinople, January 21. T Half an Hour after Twelve the Grand Signior expired, and at Half an Hour after Two the Guns from the Seraglio announced his Succeffor Abdul Hamed.

Peterfburg, January 25. On Saturday last Letters were received from General Bibikow from Casan, where he waited the Arrival of the rest of the Troops that were to join him before he marched to attack the Revolters. The Wife and Children of the Cossack, who is at the Head of them, were taken Prisoners by a Party of Russians a few Days before the Date of those Letters.

Florence, January 29. The Reflitution of Avignon and Benevento to the See of Rome has been notified in that City.

Oftend, February 9. By a rigorous Adherence to the preventive Mode of Killing, the Contagion among the horned Cattle is providentially almost at an End in this Neighbourhood; and it is to be hoped that, by the Continuance of this Mode, it may be totally eradicated.

Hague, February 18. On Tuefday the 15th Inftant, about Eleven o'Clock at Night, her Royal Highne's the Prince's of Orange was happily delivered of a Prince: This fortunate Event was immediately notified to the Publick by a Difcharge of the Artillery upon the Ramparts; but as the following Day was appointed for the annual Faft, all farther Ceremonies were deferred till Yefterday, when the ufual Notifications and Compliments were made.

Oftend, February 19. We hear, that Symptoms of the Diftemper among the horned Cattle had again appeared at one or two Places about Ipres, but that there was Reafon to believe they would not be of much Confequence.
