IS Majesty has been pleased to Command the Publication of the following Order of Coun-

At the Court at Whitchall, the Third of November, 1676.

By the Kings most Excellent Majesty, and the Right Honourable the Lords of His Majesties most Honourable Privy Council.

Hereas it hath been made appear to His Majesty in Council, That Sir Ellis Leighton Secretary to the Lord Berkeley, his Majesties late Ambassador in the Court of France, being appointed by the said Ambassador to solicite in that Court the Restitution of English Ships, and their Ladings taken by French Privateers, hath behaved himself corruptly in that Negotiation, by bare-saed contaiting for and receiving Bribes in the prosequeion of the Meichanis Affairs, and sometimes making corrupt Agreements with the French Privateers to desist from and relinquish all farther sollicitation of the Interests of His Majesties Subjects, contrary to the Trust reposed in him, and to the great Acts iment and loss of the Merchants concerned; For which Offences he was committed to the Custody of one of the Messengers of His Majesties Chamber, in order to be carried Prisoner to the Tower of London, that he might be prosecuted and brought to condigate punishment; But being conscious of his own Guilt, hath made his Escape from the Messenger, and is sted from Justice.

His Majesty therefore hath this day thought sit to Order, and doth hereby require and command all His Ossicers and loving Subjects to use their best endeavors to discover and apprehend the said Sir Ellis Leighton; and for their encouragement therein, His Majesty is pleased to declare, That such Person or Persons as shill apprehend the said Sir Ellis Leighton, and cause him to be brought before one of His Majestics Principal Scartafies of State, stall reserve a reward of One bundred Pounds sterling for so doing.

Naplas Octob. 13. The last week we had Letters from conflictingsted, which said; that orders had been sent to the Bassa; who commands the Ottoman Army against the Poles, to make a Peace with that Crown, so that it might be upon honourable Conditions; and that it was thereupon the general expessation at Confiantinoste that 2 Peace would be suddenly concluded, for that in effect the Turks were weary of a Wat with Poland, considering the resistance they had hicketto found, though their Forces were so mendal.

Vienna, Ottob. 12. The Tof the next Month, the Emperor means to part hence for Linry; and it a faid that fome dayes after will be celebrated there the Emperors Marriage, and accordingly that the Prince of Dietrich-fleyn has orders to make all haste possible in order to his conjusting the Imperial Bride thicker. The young Archduchels of Austria, the Emperors daughter, is now treated as Queen of Spain, and has her Court accordingly; About Spring the Dukt of Infantado is expected here from Mudrid, to conduct her Majesty to Spain, and at the same time the Duke de Medina de las Forras, will be appointed to receive her on the Frontiers.
