HIS Majefty has been pleafed to Commandithe Publication of the following Order of Coun-

## At the Court at Whitchall, the Third of November, 1676.

By the Kings moft Excellent Majelty, and the Right'Honourable the Lords of His Majefties moll Honourable Privy Council.

WHereas it bath been madc appear to His Mijefly in Council, Thaz Sir Ellis Leighton Secretary to the Lord Berkeley,his Majeftics late Ambaffador in the Cours of France, being appointed by the Caid Ambudusfor to follicite in that Court the Reffitution of Englifh Shits, and their Ladings taken by French Privateres, hath bebived bimfelf corruptly in syhat Negotiation, by bare-faced contialting for and receiving Bribes in the projecution of the Merchants Afffuirs, and fometimes making corrupt Agrecments woith the French Privateers to dcfift from and relinquifb all farther follicitation of the Interefts of His Majeffies Subjetts, contrary to the Truft repofid in him, and to the geteat dity iment and lofs of the Merchants concerned; Foproplicheoffences to popas committed to the Cuftody of one of the Meffengers of tis Majeflics cliamber, in order to be rarried Prifoner to the Tower of London, that be might be prof cutcd and brought to contiga punijhment; But being gan/cious of bis oron Guilt, bath made his Efrape from the Meffenger, and is fled from Jufice.
