Most Gracious Sovereign,

W E, your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Lord Mayor, Sheriffs, Commons, and Citizens, of the City of Dublin, beg Leave to approach your Majesty with our sincere Congratulations on the safe Delivery of our amiable Queen, and the Birth of a Prince.

Every Addition to your Royal Family enlarges the Prospect of our Happiness, as we hope to find the Virtues of your Majesty in your Royal De-

scendants.
