HE following Act of Parliament, passed i the Places aforefaid, be laden or taken in from in the prefent Seffions; and which takes Place on the FIRST of JUNE next, is printed for the Information of the Merchants of Great Britain and Ireland trading to North America; viz.

An AB to discontinue, in such Manner and for such Time as are therein mentioned, the landing and difcbarging, lading or shipping, of Goods, Wares, and Merebandife, at the Town, and within the Harbour, of Boston, in the Province of Massachufet's Bay, in North America.

HEREAS dangerous Commotions and Infurrections have been fomented and raifed in the Town of Boston, in the Province of Massachuset's Bay, in New England, by divers ill-affected Perfons, to the Subversion of His Majesty's Government, and to the utter Destruction of the publick Peace, and good Order of the faid Town; in which Commotions and Infurrections certain valuable Cargoes of Teas, being the Property of the East India Company, and on Board certain Vessels lying within the Bay or Harbour of Boston, were seized and destroyed : And whereas, in the prefent Condition of the faid Town and Harbour, the Commerce of His Majefty's Subjects cannot be fafely carried on there, nor the Cuftoms payable to His Majefty duly collected; and it is therefore expedient that the Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms fhould be forthwith removed from the faid Town: May it pleafe your Majefty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majefty, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Par-liament aliembled, and by the Authority of the fame, That from and after the First Day of June, One thousand feven hundred and feventy-four, it shall not be lawful for any Person or Persons whatsoever to lade or put, or cause or procure to be laden or put, off or from any Quay, Wharf, or other Place, within the faid Town of Boston, or in or upon any Part of the Shore of the Bay, commonly called the Harbour of Boston, between a certain Headland or Point called Nahant Point, on 'the Eastern Side of the Entrance into the faid Bay, and a certain other Headland or Point called Alderton Point, on the Western Side of the Entrance into the faid Bay, or in or upon any Island, Creek, Landing-Place, Bank, or other Place, within the faid Bay or Headlands, into any Ship, Vessel, Lighter, Boat, or Bottom, any Goods, Wares, or Merchandife whatfoever, to be tranf-ported or carried into any other Country, Province, or Place whatfoever, or into any other Part of the faid Province of the Mallachufet's Bay, in New England; or to take up, discharge, or lay on land, or caufe or procure to be taken up, difcharged, or laid on land, within the faid Town, or in or upon any of the Places aforefaid, out of any Boat, Lighter, Ship, Veffel, of Bottom, any Goods, Wares, or Merchandife whatfoever, to be brought from any other Country, Province, or Place, or any other Part of the faid Province of the Maffachuset's Bay in New England, upon Pain of the Forfeiture of the faid Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, and of the faid Boat, Lighter, Ship, Veffel, or other Bottom into which the fame shall be put, or out of which the fame shall be taken, and of the Guns, Ammunition, Tackle, Furniture, and Stores, in or belonging to the fame: And if any fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandife, shall, within the faid Town, or in any

the Shore into any Barge, Hoy, Lighter, Wherry, or Boat, to be carried on Board any Ship or Veffel outward bound to any other Country of Province, or other Part of the faid Province of the Massachufet's Bay in New England, or be laden or taken into fuch Barge, Hoy, Lighter, Wherry, or Boat, from or out of any Ship or Vessel coming in and arriving from any other Country or Province, or other Part of the faid Province of the Malfachufet's Bay in New England, fuch Barge, Hoy, Lighter, Wherry, or Boat, shall be forfeited and lost.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Wharfinger, or Keeper of any Wharf, Crane, or Quay, or their Servants, or any of them, shall take up or land, or knowingly suffer to be taken up or landed, or fhall fhip off, or fuffer to be waterborne, at or from any of their faid Wharfs, Cranes, or Quays, any fuch Goods, Wares, or Merchandife; in every fuch Cafe, all and every fuch Wharfinger, and Keeper of fuch Wharf, Crane, or Quay, and every Perfon what-ever who shall be assisting, or otherwise concerned in the fhipping or in the loading or putting on Board any Boat, or other Veffel, for that Purpole, or in the unfhipping fuch Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, or to whofe Hands the fame shall knowingly come after the loading, fhipping, or unfhipping thereof, fhall forfeit and lofe Treble the Value therepf, to be computed at the higheft Price which fuch Sort of Goods, Wares, and Merchandife, thall bear at the Place where fuch Offence shall be committed, at the Time when the fame shall be fo committed, together with the Veffels and Boats, and all the Horfes, Cattle, and Carriages, whatfo-ever made use of in the shipping, unshipping, landing, removing, Carriage, or Conveyance of any of the aforesaid Goods, Wares, and Merchandife.

And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That if any Ship or Veffel shall be moored or lie at Anchor, or be feen hovering within the faid Bay, defcribed and bounded as aforefaid, or within One League from the faid Bay fo defcribed, or the faid Headlands, or any of the Iflands lying between or within the fame, it shall and may be lawful for any Admiral, Chief Commander, or Commissioned Officer, of His Majesty's Fleet or Ships of War, or for any Officer of His Majeity's Culloms, to compel fuch Ship or Veffel to depart to fome other Port or Harbour, or to fuch Station as the faid Officer shall appoint, and to use such Force for that Purpose as shall be found necessary: And if fuch Ship or Veffel shall not depart accordingly, within Six Hours after Notice for that Purpose given by fuch Perfon as aforefaid, fuch Ship or Veffel, together with all the Goods laden on Board thereon, and all the Guns, Ammunition, Tackle, and Fur-niture, fhall be forfeited and loft, whether Bulk shall have been broken or not.

Provided always, That nothing in this Act con-tained shall extend, or be construct to extend, to any Military or other Stores for His Majefty's Ufe, or to the Ships or Veffels whereon the fame fhall be laden, which shall be commissioned by, and in the immediate Pay of, His Majefty, His Heirs or Suc-ceffors; nor to any Fuel or Victual brought Coaff-wife from any Part of the Continent of America, for the necessary Use and Sustenance of the Inhabitants of the faid Town of Bolton, provided the Vessel wherein the fame are to be carried shall be duly furnished with a Cocket and Let pass, after having been duly fearched by the proper Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms at Marblehead, in the Port
