And be it further enacted by the Authority afore-faid, That if any Action or Suit shall be commenced, either in Great Britain or America, against any Perfon or Persons, for any Thing done in Pursuance of this Act of Parliament, the Defendant or Defendants, in such Assion or Suit, may plead the General Issue, and give the said Ad, and the Special Matter, in Evidence, at any Trial to be had thereupon. and that the same was done in Pursuance and by the Authority of this Act : And if it shall appear to to have been done, the Jury shall find for the Defendant or Defendants; and if the Plaintiff shall be nonsuited, or discontinue his Action, after the Defendant or Defendants shall have appeared; or if Judgement shall be given upon any Verdict or Demurrer, against the Plaintiff, the Desendant or Defendants shall recover Treble Costs, and have the like Remedy for the same, as Defendants have in other Cafes by Law.
