The KING's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HIS Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Frederick North, commonly called Lord North, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Somerset, he this Day took the Oaths appointed to be taken thereupon; instead of the Oaths of Allegiance and Supremacy.

Berlin, April 5. Yesterday Prince Dolgorowky, the Russian Minister at this Court, received, by a Courier from Darmstadt, who was on his Road to Petersburg, the melancholy News of the Death of the Landgravine, Mother of the Grand Dutchess, which happened on the 30th of last Month.

Ostend, April 9. The Distemper among the Black Cattle still continues in different Parts of the Districts of Furnes and Ipres; wherever it appears he immediately kill the Sick Cattle. The Territory of Bruges; which surrounds this Town, is happily free from the Infection.
