Bri $\int_{\text {ce, }}$ Nov. 7 . The Troops of the Circles, which fepurated fome cime fince from the Imperial Army, in oricr to their ryturn home, were it feems countermanded, and have ever fince continned in the Neighborkood of Friburg, in expectarion of the fuccefs of the Duke of Lerrains defign to pals the Rhine, bur Gnding that through the oppofition of the Suiffers the fame was not like to fucceed, they marched the $4^{\text {th }}$ inglans, in or er to their going inno Winter-quarters in Sutbia, Frauconia, \&c. The Duke of Lorrain in the mean time continues encamped as formerly, being defirous to fee what fuccefs the Duke of $z e l l$ has before he removes. 7 he French Arnyy under the command of the Duke of Laxembun $g$ consinu:s as yet together.

From ahe marrfob 12 de Crequi's $C_{\text {amp at Sarque- }}$ mines, tbree Miles from Sarbrucke, on the other fide of the Saar, $N \cdot v$. 8. The Lunenburg and Munfier Troops are within fix Leagues from hence, on the other fide of Deuxports, they paffed the Rbine about 13 or 14000 ftrong, but having joined the detachement commanded by Major-General Dunewalt we reckon them 18000. The Marefchal Crequi has fent forme Infanery to reinforce the Garifon at Deuxponts, where the Sieus $d e \mathfrak{J}\{f$, who was the Kings Lieutenant at Pbilipsburg commands. The Marquis de Rcncl arrived here the 4 th inftant, witb a detachement from $\boldsymbol{F}$ landers.
\& Cologne, Nov. ir. The ofnabrug Troops continue their march towards the Mojelle, three days fince they attacked a fmall place in this Diocefs, called Lin, but were repulfed with the lofs of 70 meo, and among them Give Caprains killed, befides wonnded. The 2 Dutch Regiments who came from Treues, have orders to march back again, and to follow the ofnabsugs. From Tre ves we have Leters inform us, that the Confederate Troops under the command of the Duke of $\boldsymbol{Z}$ ell were come to Birckenfeldt two Leagues from Deuxponts; we hear of great complaints that are made of the violenges committed by the faid Troops in their march.

Hague, Nov. 13 . Though the flate of the War for the year crfuing be not yet finished, yet in the mean time it's faid that eighe new Regiments will be raifed againft Spring. Yefterday the Court of Juffice Enilhed the affair of the sicur de Groot, his Highpefs having as Stadtholder perfonally affifted there from aine in the morning till nine at night, and to morrow we expect the Sentence will be pronounced. This afternoon his Highnefs is gone to his houfe at $S$ se $\S(d y k e$, and will be back in a day or two. We bave the confirmation of a Peace being concluded between the Poles and the Turks.
Bruffis; Nov. 10. Since the arrival of the laftordinary from $S$ pogiz, here hath been much difcourfe at Court of great Levies that are to be made againf spring, in order to the forming an Army of : soce men, to be under the fole command of our Governor-General; and to thisend, we are in expe $t a-$ tion of receiving by the next Spanifh Ordinary Bills of Exchange for a Millon or two of Crowns; in the dipatch of whicly, the new Prefident of the-Finenness in $S_{\text {pain }}$ is 25 we bre rold vetyrzealous. From $C_{\text {ambray }}$ we bear that feveral parties have beenfent abroad from thence inio the Frenol Tersitories to raif Contribucions, one of which in 2 Village near $\mu$ Arras found fome refifance from a finall numler of soldiers, fent from Arras, but the Spaniards entred the Villape,


General dgurto has put the Troops defigned to Si omers into that place, and is come back bither, where he intends to remain this winter. The Rifhop of ofnabrug-having left his Tronps in the Dioceds of Corgre, which, in's faid at prefent hardly amnunt to 3000 meti, with ordery to continue their march towards the Mofille, is gone home attended with his Guards onely, having promifed to recruit hir faid Troops againft Spring. From Liege they write, that, a great Convor with 3 or 4000 Horfe are going from ebarleroy to Maftricht toy the way of $C$ ndros, which is the onely part of that Countrey which hath not been already ruined in this War. The laft Letrers we had from the Duke of Zulls Camp were daced the $51 b$ inftant ac Kasfell; a bout four- Leapues ffom Deaxponts, which faid, that the day following the Army was to march. From Alface we underftand, tbat :he Duke of Lorrain had ncw quitred all thoughts of paffing the fibite, but that far want of fabfiftence he would be obliged to put bis Army yery qiuckis into Winter- quareers.

Difto, Now. 13. We ftill difceurfe of great preparations againt Spring, and we expect with fume impatience the arrival of the Spanifh Oidinary, which, it's faid, will bring Bills for a very confiderable Sum. They write from alface that both Armies continue in the fame porture as formerlys and that both have received orders to go into Winter. quarters and from Col.gne, that on Friday laft the young Princes of Neulourg paffed by theres in their way tow ards Nexlowyg, to be prefent at the Empreffes Marriage, which is to becelebrated the $9: b$ of the next month at Paffam. The Troops of Ofnabrag continue their march towards the Mofelle, to join with the Duke of Zell, and likewife the two Holland Regiments that came from Treves, have received orders to march after the Ofaabrag Troops, who in their march through the Pais de Crlogne, did atrack the Caftie of Linne, where they werc repulfed with the lofs of above 150 men, befides many wounded, We are told from $M_{i}$ 亿 that Monfieur de Resel is come with a detachement from Marefchal liequi to Sarbrac, to obferve themotions of the Duke of Zell, and that the. French were refolve to defend Deuxpems, Our Italian Ietcers by this laft drdinary affure us, thatste Marquis $C$ ftel fiodrago the new Viceroy of Sicily, hath forced the French to recire, from a poft they tad taken near Syracufa; that in the retreat the Fienctr loft feveral Men, and amongit them fome officers of Quality, whereof the Lieurenant-General of the Cavalry in faid to be one; neicher did the Spaniards eome off without fols though notifo confiderable as the French; a Lieutenant $G_{c-}$ nerail of the Spaniards is alfo faid to be wounded.
-Pawis, Nour 14. The Court is at preferit at St Germain, where it will pals the winter. The Armies in Alfac, and $\mathrm{Br} / \mathrm{g}$ ( are now in gond earneff preparing to go imo Winter quarters; but as for thofe commanded by the Duke of $Z_{1} / l$ and the Marefchal $C$ guz it is very probablethey will come to an Engagement. Two days fince we received a certain account athe conclufion of a Peace between the iPoles and the Turks verj honourable for the firft.

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
