Peterfburg, March 29. Great Number of Military Promotions took place Yesterday. Amongst those who obtained the Rank of Lieutenant-General was the Prince of Heffe Darmstadt : That of Brigadier was conferred on the Prince of Anhalt. General Potemkin was made Lieutenant-Colonel of the First or Preobrazinsky Regiment of Foot Guards, of which the Empress is Colonel.

A Courier arrived on Sunday last from General Bibikow with an Account of the Success of a Body of Seven Hundred Men, which he had detached under the Command of a Major, to prevent the Rebels from falling upon Cathrinenbourg ; that the Rebels had loft upon this Occasion between fix and feven hundred Men; and that the General was in hopes foon to come up with their main Body, and

to be able to give a good Account of them. Hague, April 19.
