*W*HEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, That, in the Night between the Eighth and Ninth Days of April last, the Warehouse of Stephen Shakespear, of the City of Coventry, Silkman, was broken open, and a considerable Quantity of dyed unwrought Silk, Love, and White Lace, with Fifty Pounds in Cash, (to the Value in the Whole of near three Hundred Pounds, as is estimated, in Goods and Money) were stolen thereout; and that, notwithstanding great Pains have been taken, no Discovery has yet been made: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said Robbery, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any one of them, who shall discover his or her Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a farther Encouragement, the said Stephen Shakespear doth hereby promise a Reward of TWENTY GUINEAS to any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid to Sir John Fielding in London, or to Mr. Alderman Hewitt at Coventry, (besides the Reward allowed by Act of Parliament on Conviction of the Offenders) or if any Person will impeach his Accomplice or Accomplices he shall receive a like Reward; the said Rewards to be paid on the Conviction of one or more of the Offenders.
