Petersbourg, May 17.

IN Consequence of the Turks being in Motion, the Generals Suworow and Karkinsky have passed the Danube with the Corps under their respective Commands.

Vienna, May 28. Field Marshal Neuperg died two Days ago, at the Age of Ninety. Prince Charles Lichtenstein succeeds him as Governor of this City. General Count Xavier Harrach has got Field Marshal Neuperg's Regiment.

Berlin, May 31. His Prussian Majesty returned to Potsdam on Saturday last from Magdeburg, and set out the Day following for Pomerania and Prussia, to review the Troops in those Parts, from whence he will return the 12th of next Month. His Majesty is accompanied by the Prince of Prussia, and Prince Frederick of Brunswick.

Their Royal Highnesses the Prince and Princess Ferdinand of Prussia went last Wednesday to Frederickfeldt to pass the Summer Season.

Brussels, June 3. On Wednesday last his Royal Highness the Archduke Maximilian, who travels under the Title of Count de Burgau, arrived here, accompanied by Counts Rosenbergh and Lamberg. His Royal Highness proposes passing two or three Months in this Country, during which Time he intends visiting all the principal Towns in it.

Hague, June 7. The Prince and Princess of Orange left this Town early Yesterday Morning for Soesdyck, where they propose passing Ten Days or a Fortnight, from whence their Highnesses will go to Loo for some Weeks.

St. James's, June 11.

Advice has been received from the Island of Madeira, of the Arrival there of the Ashburnham and Anson on the 21st of April last, after a very favourable Passage of Ten Days. They were to sail from Madeira on the 1st of May, with General Clavering, the Judges, and Council, on Board, on their Voyage to the East-Indies.
