HIS Day, the Lords being met, a Mesfage was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by Sir Francis Molineux, Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that the Lords, authorized by Virtue of His Majesty's Commission, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Asses agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate Attendance of this Honourable House in the House of Peers, to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the faid Commission, impowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great-Britain, the Lord President of the Council, and feveral other Lords therein mentioned, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Affent given to

An Act for raising a certain Sum of Money by Loans or Exchaquer Bills, for the Service of the Year, One

thoujand seven hundred and seventy four.

An Act to frewent the Exportation to Foreign Parts, of Utenfils made Use of in the Cotton, Linen, Woollen

and \ilk wanufactures of this Kingdom.

An Ast for ascertaining the Duty on Printed, Painted, Stained, or Died Stuffs, wholly made of Cotton, and manufactured in Great Britain, and for aliowing the Use and Wear thereof under certain Regulations.

An Art to extend so much of an Art passed in the

Twelfth Year of the Reign of this preent Majefty, as relates to Distillers or Makers of Low Wines and Spirits from Corn, to every Kind of Distiller, and for the more effectual securing the Revenue of Excise arising the Manual of the Manual Allowance to be made to the Manufacturers of Wool and Linen, in respect of the Duties on Sope imported and used in the Woolten and Linen Manufactures.

An Act for reducing the Rates and Duties payable upon the Importation of Great Raifens

un Act to continue the several Laws therein mentioned, for the better Encouragement of the making of! Sail Cloth in Great Britain, and for Jecuring the Duties upon Foreign-made Sail Cloth, and charging Foreignmade Sails with a Duty.

An At to prevent certain Inconveniencies that may

bappen by Bills of Naturalization.

An Ast for explaining an Ast made in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of Queen Anne, intituled, An Ast to reduce the Rate of Interest without any Prejudice to Parliamentary Securities.

An A& to prevent the Mischiefs that arise from dri-ving Cattle within the Cities of London and Westminster, and Liberties thereof, and the Bills of Mortality.

An Ast more effectually to improve and complete the Navigation of the River Thames Wejiward of London Bridge, within the Libe ties of the City of London; and to prevent any Vessel or Barge from being moored in

Taplow Mill Stream in the County of Bucks.

An Act for altering and amending an Act made in the Sixteenth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intitu-led, An Act to explain and amend the Laws touching the Elections of Members to serve for the Commons in Parliament for that Part of Great Britain called Scot-lond, and to restrain the Partiality, and regulate the Conduct, of Returning Officers at fuch Elections, by altering the Time of Notice ordered by the Jaid Act to be given in the Service of Complaints to the Court of Session, of Wrongs done in Elections, and by regulating the Manner, and settling the Place of Election of a Burgess to serve in Parliam nt, for a District of Boroughs in Scotland, when the Election of the Magistrates and Council of a Borough, which ought in Courfe to be the

presiding Borough at an Election, happens to be reduced and mide woid by a Decree of the Court of Seffion, and not received by the Crown, when fuch Election is made.

An Act for the better Regulation of the Nightly
Watch and Beadles within the City and Liberty of

Westminster, and Parts adjacent, and for other Purposes

therein mentioned.

An Act for the further and better Regulation of Buildings and Party-Walls, and for the more effectually preventing Mischiefs by Fire within the Cities of London and Westminster, and the Liberties thereof, and other the Parispes, Precincts, and Places within the Weekly Bills of Mortality, the Parispes of Saint Mary le Bon, Paddington, Saint Pancras, and St. Luke at Chelsea in the County of Middlesex, and for indemnifying, under certain Conditions, Builders and other Persons against the Penalties to which they are or may be liable for erecting Buildings within the Limits aforefaid, contrary to Law.

An AI for explaining and altering an AEI made in the Thirteenth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to explain and amend and reduce into one Ast of Parliament, the general Laws now in being for regulating of Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England, and for other Purposes, so far as the fame lates to the Payment of additional Tolls at Weighing Engines, and the Number of Horses to be used in Carriages drawn on Turnpike Roads, and for allowing certain Exemptions with respect to Weight and Payment

of Toll in particular Cafes.

An Ast to enable His Majesty to allow the Administrator with the Will annexed, or other the Personal Representative of Sir Joseph Jekyll, Knight, deceased, to sell Ten Thousand Pouna's South Sea Stock, Part of a Legacy given by him to the Use of the Sinking Fund, 10 receive the Dividends due thereon, as also on Ten Thousand Pounds East India Stock; and for applying the Jame as therein is mentioned.

An Act for establishing a new Church or Chatel erecting at Foxteth Park in the Parish of Walton near Liverpool in the County Palatine of Lancaster.

An Act for rebuilding the Church of the Parish of

Lewisham in the County of Kent.
An Act to amend an Act passed in the Tenth and Elewenth Years of the Reign of King William the Third, intituled, An Act for making and keeping navigable the Rivers of Aire and Calder in the County of Y rk; and for improving the Navigation of the faid River Aire, from Weeland to the River Ouze; and for making a navigable Canal from the faid River Aire at or near Huddlesey, to the River Ouze at the Old Brick Garth ad Ouze Gate End, within the Township of Selby in the faid County; and for other Purpofes.

An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of an Act passed in the Ninth Year of His present Majisty, for repairing and widening the Road from Bewerley to the Ferry at Hessle, and from the Malton Guide Post to the Gravel Pit at Cottingham, in the County of York; and for repairing and widening other Roads therein

mentioned.
