A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE R.

WHEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Twenty-fourth Day of June last, We have commanded, that, from and after the Sixteenth Day of this Instant July, all Guineas, Half Guineas, and Quarter Guineas, more deficient in Weight than the Rates specified in the following Table, viz.

should not be allowed to be Current within Our Kingdom of Ireland, except in Payments to be made at the Receipt of Our Exchequer in Ireland, or to the Collectors or Receivers of Our Revenues, there, or to such Person or Persons as should be appointed by His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland for Receiving and Exchanging the same.

And whereas it has been represented unto Us, by the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, that it will greatly tend to the Accommodation of Our Subjects, in Our said Kingdom of Ireland, if a further Time was allowed for the Currency of the said Guineas, Half Guineas, and Quarter Guineas, there: We, therefore, being willing to provide for the Convenience of Our said Subjects, do hereby Will and Command, that the Time during which all Guineas, Half Guineas, and Quarter Guineas, more deficient in Weight than the Rates abovementioned shall be current within Our Kingdom of Ireland, shall be, and the same is hereby enlarged, until the Fifth Day of August next, inclusive, so as the Deficiency of all and every Piece thereof doth not exceed the Rates settled by the Commissioners of Our Treasury, in their Order of the Twenty-third Day of July last; any Thing in our said former Proclamation to the contrary hereof notwithstanding.

And we do further Declare and Command, that from and after the said Fifth Day of August next, all Guineas, Half Guineas, and Quarter Guineas, more deficient in Weight than the Rates specified in the foregoing Table, be not allowed to be Current, or to pass, in any Payment within Our said Kingdom of Ireland, except in Payments to be made at the Receipt of Our Exchequer in Ireland, or to the Collectors or Receivers of Our Revenues there, or to such Person or Persons as shall be appointed by his Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, for Receiving and Exchanging the same; whose Appointment shall be signified, by Order of his Excellency, in such Manner as to his Lordship shall seem meet.

And We do strictly Require and Command Our Vice-Treasurer and Receiver-General, and Paymaster-General of Our Revenues, Profits, and Casualties, within Our Kingdom of Ireland, and his and their Deputy and Deputies, and Teller of Our Exchequer there, and all the Collectors and Receivers of Our Taxes and Revenues within Our said Kingdom of Ireland, from the said Fifth Day of August next inclusive, to the Fifth Day of September next inclusive, to take and receive in Payment and Discharge of Our Revenues and Taxes,

such of the said deficient Gold Coin of this Realm as shall be so tendered to them, so as the Deficiency of all and every Piece thereof doth not exceed the Rates settled by the Commissioners of Our Treasury, in their Order before-mentioned.

And We do in like Manner strictly Require and Command such Person or Persons as shall be appointed as aforesaid, that between the said Fifth Day of August and the Fifth Day of September next, they do receive such of the said deficient Gold Coin as shall be tendered to them by any Person or Persons whomsoever, so as the Deficiency of every Piece thereof doth not exceed the Rates settled by the Commissioners of Our Treasury, in their Order before-mentioned; and that they give in Exchange for the same, other Coin allowed from henceforth to pass in Payment, and be Current; that is to say, Guineas, Half Guineas, and Quarter Guineas, not more deficient in Weight than is specified in the foregoing Table.

And We do hereby Will and Command, that from and after the said Fifth Day of September next, all Guineas, Half Guineas, and Quarter Guineas, more deficient in Weight than the Rates specified in the foregoing Table, be not allowed to pass or be Current in any Payment whatsoever within Our said Kingdom of Ireland, except that We think proper to allow Fourteen Days to the Collectors and Receivers of Our Revenues and Taxes, resident in Our Kingdom of Ireland, for the Purpose of remitting and paying such of the said deficient Coin received by them in Payment and Discharge of Our Revenues and Taxes, at the Receipt of Our Exchequer in Ireland, or to the Receiver-General and Paymaster-General of Our Revenues, Profits, and Casualties, within Our said Kingdom of Ireland, according to the Course of Payment, in each Branch of Our Revenues respectively.

And We do strictly Require and Enjoin Our Vice-Treasurer, and Receiver-General, and Paymaster-General, and Teller of Our Exchequer, resident in Our Kingdom of Ireland, during the said Fourteen Days respectively, and no longer, to receive from the Collectors and Receivers in the Country alone, and from no other Person, the said deficient Gold Coin of Our Realm, in Payment and Discharge of the several Branches of Our Revenues and Taxes, so as that every Piece of such Gold Coin be not more deficient in Weight than the Rates settled by the Commissioners of Our Treasury, in their Order before-mentioned.

Given at Our Court at St James's the Eighth Day of July, One thousand seven hundred and seventy-four, in the Fourteenth Year of Our Reign.

St. James's, July 8.

This Day **Monf. de Pinto**, Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of Portugal, had his first Private Audience of His Majesty, to deliver his Credentials.

To which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Suffolk, (in the Absence of the Right Honourable the Earl of Rochford) one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by **Stephen Cottrell, Esq;** Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

Naples, May 31. The Court is removed from Portici to this Capital for the Summer Season. Yesterday being his Sicilian Majesty's Name-Day there was a Grand Gala and Baccio Manos at the Palace.

Petersburg, June 7. Orders are given for fitting out three Ships of the Line, and two Frigates, at Cronstadt, which are to join two other Ships of the Line, and two Frigates, at Revel, about the Middle of this Month, to cruize in the Baltick.

Petersburg, June 14. General Potemkin was on Saturday last appointed to the Office of Vice-President of the College of War, with the Rank of General in Chief. At the same Time Prince Vefemskoy was raised to the Rank of actual Privy Councillor.

The Court comes to Town on Thursday next, and proposes removing to Peterhoff on the Monday following.

Stockholm, June 21. A Courier, who arrived here early on the 18th Instant, brought M. de Vergennes (the French Ambassador at this Court) Advice of his being appointed Minister of State for the Foreign Department, with Orders to take Leave of this Court, and to return home with all convenient Expedition: His Excellency went a few Hours after to the Camp, to inform his Swedish Majesty of it; and proposes to set out for Paris on the 26th.

Though some seasonable Rains have fallen in other Parts of Sweden, we have had continual dry Weather during the whole Course of the Spring. It is much feared that the Crops will be very thin, or that some Kinds of Grain will fail entirely.

Berlin, June 28. His Prussian Majesty has appointed his Serene Highness Prince Frederick of Brunswick to the Provostship of the Chapter of Brandenburg, which was vacant by the Death of General Pouquet. His Highness went Yesterday to Potsdam to pay his Court, and pursues his Journey to Brandenburg Tomorrow, in order to be installed.

The Canal, which his Prussian Majesty lately caused to be cut from the Vistula to the Netze, is now entirely finished, and will be open for the Use of the Publick on the First of July. This Canal begins at Bromberg on the Vistula, and extends to Lukosch on the Netze, which is now rendered navigable as far as Dreifen, where it falls into the Drawe; the Drawe joins the Warta at Lansberg, and the Warta falling into the Oder at Custrin, makes now a free Communication between the Vistula and the Oder for the Passage of all Sorts of Merchandize.

Hamburg, June 28. We learn from Wismar, that the Princess of Eutin, now Dutchess of Sudermania, attended by all her Court, set out on the 25th Instant about Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon from that Place in a Barge, and in four Hours afterwards arrived safely at the Anchoring-Place, where her Royal Highness embarked on board the Admiral's Ship. The Squadron was to sail as soon as the Wind would permit.
