*St. James's, July 8.*

This Day Mons. de Pinto, Envoy Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the King of Portugal, had his first Private Audience of His Majesty, to deliver his Credentials.

To which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Suffolk, (in the Absence of the Right Honourable the Earl of Rochford) one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and conducted by Stephen Cottrell, Esq; Assistant-Master of the Ceremonies.

*Naples, May 31.* The Court is removed from Portici to this Capital for the Summer Season. Yesterday being his Sicilian Majesty's Name-Day there was a Grand Gala and Baccio Manos at the Palace.

*Petersburg, June 7.* Orders are given for fitting out three Ships of the Line, and two Frigates, at Cronstadt, which are to join two other Ships of the Line, and two Frigates, at Revel, about the Middle of this Month, to cruize in the Baltick.

*Petersburg, June 14.* General Potemkin was on Saturday last appointed to the Office of Vice-President of the College of War, with the Rank of General in Chief. At the same Time Prince Vefemskoy was raised to the Rank of actual Privy Councillor.

The Court comes to Town on Thursday next, and proposes removing to Peterhoff on the Monday following.

*Stockholm, June 21.* A Courier, who arrived here early on the 18th Instant, brought M. de Vergennes (the French Ambassador at this Court) Advice of his being appointed Minister of State for the Foreign Department, with Orders to take Leave of this Court, and to return home with all convenient Expedition: His Excellency went a few Hours after to the Camp, to inform his Swedish Majesty of it; and proposes to set out for Paris on the 26th.

Though some seasonable Rains have fallen in other Parts of Sweden, we have had continual dry Weather during the whole Course of the Spring. It is much feared that the Crops will be very thin, or that some Kinds of Grain will fail entirely.

*Berlin, June 28.* His Prussian Majesty has appointed his Serene Highness Prince Frederick of Brunswick to the Provostship of the Chapter of Brandenburg, which was vacant by the Death of General Pouquet. His Highness went Yesterday to Potsdam to pay his Court, and pursues his Journey to Brandenburg Tomorrow, in order to be installed.

The Canal, which his Prussian Majesty lately caused to be cut from the Vistula to the Netze, is now entirely finished, and will be open for the Use of the Publick on the First of July. This Canal begins at Bromberg on the Vistula, and extends to Lukosch on the Netze, which is now rendered navigable as far as Dreifen, where it falls into the Drawe; the Drawe joins the Warta at Lansberg, and the Warta falling into the Oder at Cultrin, makes now a free Communication between the Vistula and the Oder for the Passage of all Sorts of Merchandize.

*Hamburg, June 28.* We learn from Wismar, that the Princess of Eutin, now Dutchess of Sudermania, attended by all her Court, set out on the 25th Instant about Eleven o'Clock in the Forenoon from that Place in a Barge, and in four Hours afterwards arrived safely at the Anchoring-Place, where her Royal Highness embarked on board the Admiral's Ship. The Squadron was to sail as soon as the Wind would permit.
