*Stockholm, July 1.*  
**T**HE King has granted Leave to Mr. Martin Torngren, a Merchant of Gothenburg, to erect a Company for carrying on a Whale-Fishery on the Coast of Greenland, and Davis's Straits.

On the 25th past the Camp broke up, and his Swedish Majesty marched into this City at the Head of the Regiment of Guards, of which he is Colonel.

Last Week M. de Vergennes the French Ambassador had a private Audience of Leave of the King of Sweden; and on the Evening of the 26th, his Excellency set out for Paris.

This Court has received Advice, that the Ceremony of the Espousals was performed at Wismar on the 21st of last Month, and that the Dutches of Sudermania was to embark on the 25th, upon which Account her Royal Highness is daily expected.

*Vienna, July 2.* By a Letter, received from Marshal Romanzow, dated at Foczany the 17th of June, we are informed, that on the 13th of that Month a Russian Corps, commanded by General Kamenkoy, after putting to Flight a Body of about 5000 Turkish Cavalry, made themselves Masters of the Town of Bajardieck. The Russians took three Cannons, and about 150 Prisoners: Their own Loss is said to be very inconsiderable.

*Munich, July 3.* The Court was Yesterday very much alarmed by an unhappy Accident which happened to the Electress Dowager of Saxony, who came to Town with the Electoral Family to view his Highness's Horses in the Manage: A Partition, which separated the Spectators from that Part of the House where the Horses are exercised, unfortunately gave Way, and falling down upon the Electress Dowager, broke her Left Leg a little above the Ankle: The Weight of the Partition was so great, that it was some Time before her Highness could be disengaged from it. Her Highness shewed great Fortitude on this melancholy Occasion. To-day her Highness is much better than could have been expected; and is thought to be in a fair Way of Recovery.

The Elector and Electress of Bavaria express the greatest Concern for her Highness's Misfortune, and have removed from Nymphenburg to Munich, where they intend to remain till the Electress Dowager is in a Condition to be moved.

*Berlin, July 5.* On Friday last her Serene Highness the Dutches of Brunwick arrived at Potsdam; the Prince and Princess of Prussia set out the Day before for Rhinsberg.

*Ostend, July 13.* Yesterday an Edict, dated at Brussels the 9th Instant, was received here by the Board of Finances, permitting the Exportation of Wheat and Rye; subject, however, to the Duties subsisting since the Exportation was stopt in April, 1770.
