Whereas, by an Act passed this Session, intituled, An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in this Session of Parliament, for granting Annuities with Benefit of Survivorship, in Manner therein provided, the Lord Lieutenant of this Kingdom for the Time being is empowered to appoint one or more Person or Persons to pay in the City of London the Annuities mentioned in the said Act; His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant hath been pleased to appoint Messrs. Browns and Collinson, of the City of London, Bankers, for the Purposes aforesaid, of which all Persons whom it may concern are to take Notice.
