Stockholm, July 8.

ON the 1st of this Month the Swedish Squadron from Wismar anchored at Dalareo, near the Entrance of this River. On the 3d the Dutchess of Sudermania, and her Attendants, were conveyed in Barges to Erstawyck; at which Place her Royal Highness was complimented on the Part of the King of Sweden by two Senators, and on the Part of the two Queens and the rest of the Royal Family by the Principal Officers of their Household. On the 5th her Royal Highness went by Land to Nuckelwyck, where she was received by the two Queens, his Swedish Majesty and his two Brothers having met her Royal Highness about Half-Way between Erstawyck and Nuckelwyck. On the 7th in the Morning a Deputation of Six Senators waited on her Royal Highness to conduct her to this City. Her Royal Highness went on board a very magnificent Barge, which was accompanied by Twelve others, and was saluted, as she passed, by a great Number of Cannon placed on the two Shores, by all the Merchant-Ships in the River ranged in a Line, and by two Gallies and a Frigate adorned with Streamers, and moored opposite to the Palace. Her Royal Highness landed under a beautiful Pavilion erected for the Purpose, where she found the Duke of Sudermania, with the whole Senate, and the Principal Officers and Ladies of the Court; and her Royal Highness was complimented by the Great Governor and Magistracy of this City. After ascending to the Palace through a Lane of Dragoons, Halberdeers, and Guards, her Royal Highness was saluted by Volleys of small Arms, and by 256 Pieces of Cannon, and conducted to the King. On retiring to her own Apartment, the Senators and their Ladies; and the Foreign Ministers, were presented to her Royal Highness.

In the Evening the Ceremony of the Marriage was performed in the Court-Chapel, with great Pomp and Splendour: All the Nobility and Foreign Ministers attended; and the Royal Family supped in Publick. This Day their Royal Highnesses received the Compliments of all the different Corps Civil and Military, and dined in Publick: In the Evening a Swedish Comedy is to be performed in the Hall of the States. The greatest Order has been observed, and the utmost Magnificence displayed on this Occasion. The Festivals will be continued, with proper Days of Interval, till the 20th of this Month.

Vienna, July 9. His Imperial Majesty returned Yesterday from the Camp of Artillery in Bohemia.

Bruges, July 10. The Distemper among the Black Cattle is totally stopped in the Austrian Netherlands; and it has been observed, that where Inoculation has been practised, the Cattle have not been infected a Second Time.

Ossend, July 21. Last Market-Day the Farmers, on account of the Permission lately given to export Corn, kept back the usual Supply for the Market with a View to raise the Price; which causing a temporary Dearth among the Poor in this and other Towns, the Magistrates informed the Court of it, in consequence of which an Express arrived here this Morning early with Orders to those who had lodged Corn for Exportation, to supply the weekly Markets with the necessary Quantity, at the Price they paid for it. The Fiscal of Flanders has also sent circular Orders to all the Parishes to furnish the Markets of the neighbouring Towns with the necessary Corn, at the Price it bore before the Ex-

portation was allowed, with Orders to the proper Officers here to stop the Exportation when the Price of the sixteenth Part of a Raziere (or about Eighteen Pounds Weight, the smallest Measure here) shall exceed, by more than one Penny, the Price before Exportation; in consequence of which Regulation there was Plenty of Corn at this Market Today, at very little more than the usual Price.
