Whereas it hath been humbly represented to His Majesty, That a Turnpike Gate, erected across the Road in the Tything of Baynton in the Parish of Edington in the County of Wilts, by Order of the Trustees acting under an Act of Parliament passed in Ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George

George the Third, intituled, "An Act to enlarge the Term and Powers of an Act passed in the Thirty first Year of the Reign of His late Majesty, For amending the Road from Pengate to Latchetts Bridge, and other Roads in the County of Wilts, and for amending several Roads near adjoining to the said Roads," was, on the 1st of February last past, in the Night Time, wilfully, maliciously and feloniously, taken down and greatly damaged by some Person or Persons unknown; and that, on the 16th of the same Month of February, the said Turnpike Gate, after being repaired and again erected, was also in the Night Time wilfully, maliciously and feloniously, intirely destroyed by some Person or Persons likewise unknown; and that, on the Fourth of April last past, the Toll House, which was lately new built for the Use of the Collectors appointed to receive the Tolls ordered to be collected at the Tything of Baynton aforesaid, was also in the Night Time wilfully, maliciously and feloniously, greatly damaged by being blown up with Gunpowder, and was thereby rendered utterly uninhabitable; and the Collector and his Wife, then residing therein, were violently assaulted and greatly bruised, and were forcibly turned out of the said Toll House by about Ten Persons disguised, and dressed in what are called Smock or Carters Frocks, and who are likewise unknown: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in either of the said Felonies, doth hereby promise His most gracious Pardon to any one who shall make Discovery of his, her, or their, Accomplice or Accomplices in the said Felonies, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

HIS Majesty having signified to my Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty His Royal Pleasure, That the Uniform Cloathing, appointed to be worn by the Captains and Commanders of His Fleet, shall be altered in the Manner mentioned at the Foot hereof; that the Uniform so altered shall be considered as the Full Dress; and that a Blue Frock, with embroidered Buttonholes, conformable to the Pattern lodged at the Navy-Office, be allowed to be worn upon common Occasions: Their Lordships do hereby give Notice thereof to the Captains and Commanders of His Majesty's Fleet, and direct and require them respectively to conform strictly thereto.

Alterations in the present Uniform Cloathing of the Captains and Commanders of His Majesty's Fleet, viz.

The Lace on the Coat to return round the Pockets and Sleeves; the Lappels and Cuffs to be two Inches and an Half broad; the Lace upon the upper Part of the Lappels to run even with the bottom Lace of the Collar; the Buttons to be flat, with an Anchor and Cable engraved thereon, according to the Pattern lodged at the Navy-Office.

The Waistcoat to be Plain instead of Laced; the Breeches to be of the same Colour of the Waistcoat instead of Blue; and both to have Buttons of the same Pattern as the Coat.

Undress.

Blue Frock, Lappels, Cuffs, and Collar the same; the Collar to button to the Lappels, lap over behind, White Shaloon Lining, Buttons the same as to the Dress

Coat, Gold embroidered Buttonholes, as undermentioned, viz.

For Captains who have taken Post Three Years or Upwards Twelve Holes in the Lappels by Three's, Three in the Flaps, and Three in the Sleeves.

For Post Captains of less than Three Years standing, Twelve Holes in the Lappels by Two's; Four Holes in the Flaps, and Four in the Sleeves, by Two's.

For Commanders, Twelve Holes in the Lappels regular, Thre Holes in the Flaps, and Three in the Sleeves.

Waistcoats and Breeches the same as for the Dressed Uniform.
