Whereas it has been humbly represented to the King, That, in the Month of April, 1771, a Hay-Stack, in the Parish of Mearns in the County of Renfrew in Scotland, the Property of Robert Allason, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire by Persons unknown; and also, that, about Autumn of the Year 1772 another Hay-Stack, in the aforesaid Parish, the Property also of the said Robert Allason, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire by Persons unknown; and likewise, that, in the Night between the 12th and 13th Days of the Month of May last past, a Farm-house and Cow-house upon the Farm of Mainhouse in the Parish and County aforesaid, the Property of Sir Michael Stewart, Baronet, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire by Persons unknown: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person, or Persons, concerned in burning of the said Hay-Stacks and Houses, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person or Persons concerned in the Burning of the Hay-Stacks or Houses, (except the Person or Persons who actually set Fire to the said Hay-Stacks or Houses) who shall discover to a Magistrate his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

Whereas it hath been humbly represented to His Majesty, That a Turnpike Gate, erected across the Road in the Tything of Baynton in the Parish of Edington in the County of Wilts, by Order of the Trustees acting under an Act of Parliament passed in Ninth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty King George
