Peterburg, August 9.
A Messenger is arrived from Casan with the News that the Corps, which accompanied Pugatcheff in his Retreat, has been again defeated: and as he is now got into an open Country, there is more Probability than ever of his being taken.

Marthal Romanzow's Son, who brought the News of the Peace, is advanced to the Rank of Major General; and Count Soltikow is made General in Chief.

Peterburg, August 12. Prince Reprin arrived late last Night at Peterhoff, with the Treaty of Peace and the Ratification; in consequence of which the Empress came to Town at Eight o'Clock this Evening.

Stockholm, August 19. The Corn Harvest has been very plentiful in most of the Provinces of Sweden: In Scania Rye sells from nineteen to twenty Copper Dollars a Ton; in most other Parts the Price is under twenty-four Dollars. The King of Sweden has permitted a free Exportation of Grain.
