Meffenger is arrived from Cafan with the News that the Corps, which accompanied Pugatcheff in his Retreat, has been again defeated : and as he is now got into an open Country, there is more Probability than ever of his being taken.

Marshal Romanzow's Son, who brought the News of the Peace, is advanced to the Rank of Major General; and Count Soltikow is made General in Chief.

Petersburg, August 12. Prince Repnin arrived late last Night at Peterhoff, with the Treaty of Peace and the Ratification; in confequence of which the Empress came to Town at Eight o'Clock this Even-

ing. Stockholm, August 19. The Corn Harvest has been very glentiful in most of the Provinces of Sweden: Second Ryce fells from nineteen to twenty Copper Dollars a Ton; in most other Parts the Price is un-der twenty-four Dollars. The King of Sweden has permitted a free Exportation of Grain.
