Petersburg, August 16. On Sunday Morning last Peace with the Ottoman Porte was proclaimed in four different Parts of this Capital by a Major of the Guards, who officiated as Herald on that Occafion; and immediately afterwards her Imperial Majesty, accompanied by the great Duke and Dutchess, proceeded to the Church of Casan, where, after the Celebration of Mass, Te Deum was sung, at which all the Nobility and Foreign Ministers were present. In the Evening there was a brilliant Court at the Summer Palace.

As the Preparations for the Celebration of the Peace are not yet finished, the Empress and their Imperial Highnesses propose to remove to Zarsco-Zelo on Thursday next.
