*Messina, August 2.*  
**T**HE Corn Harvest in Sicily has been very plentiful this Year; nevertheless it is said that the Prohibition on the Exportation will be continued.

*Naples, August 16.* On Saturday last being the Birth-day of her Sicilian Majesty, there was a Grand Gala, and Bacia Manos at Court; the Prince of Aliano was the same Day appointed Vice-Roy of Sicily, and honoured with the Order of St. Januarius.

By Accounts from Rome the Heats have been more intense there by some Degrees than in this Kingdom, tho' Fahrenheit's Thermometer was once at Eighty five Degrees and an Half in the Shade.

*Petersburg, August 16.* On Sunday Morning last Peace with the Ottoman Porte was proclaimed in four different Parts of this Capital by a Major of the Guards, who officiated as Herald on that Occasion; and immediately afterwards her Imperial Majesty, accompanied by the great Duke and Dutchess, proceeded to the Church of Casan, where, after the Celebration of Mass, Te Deum was sung, at which all the Nobility and Foreign Ministers were present. In the Evening there was a brilliant Court at the Summer Palace.

As the Preparations for the Celebration of the Peace are not yet finished, the Emperess and her Imperial Highnesses propose to remove to Zarco-Zelo on Thursday next.

Advice was received from Nisne-Novogorod on Sunday last, that Pugatcheff had been again defeated, and obliged to leave the Road leading to Astracan, to which Place he was directing his Course.

*Florence, August 23.* The excessive Heat, and the total Want of Rain for more than two Months in most Parts of Italy, have greatly prejudiced the Harvest. The Great Duke is using all the Means in his Power to get Supplies of Corn from other Countries.

*Turin, August 26.* We have not had a Drop of Rain here these two Months, and the hottest Weather that ever was known; the Harvest in general has been unfavorable.

*St. James's, September 10.*

The King has been pleased to grant unto Roger Moityn Clerk A. M. the Place and Dignity of a Prebendary of His Majesty's Free Chapel of St. George in the Castle of Windsor, void by the Death of Dr. John Foster, late one of the Prebendaries thereof.

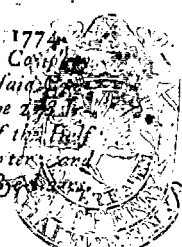
