Vienna, August 27. His Imperial Majesty is expected here from the Camp at Pest on the last Day of this Month; after which the Court will remove to Laxenbourg, where there is likewise to be a Camp.

Oftend, September 7. By an Ordinance of the 3d Instant, the Exportation of Wheat and Rye is prohibited by Sea, but the Carriage by Land to-
