This Day Major Carleton arrived from Marshal Romanzow's Army, with an Account that the Peace with the Russians was signed by Marshal Romanzow and Prince Repnin on the 21st of July.

Naples, August 23. Prayers for Rain are offered up in all the Churches of this City, the Drought having been of so long Continuance.

Vienna, August 24. It was reported Yesterday at the Camp at Pest, that the Grand Vizir, who lately commanded the Turkish Army, died suddenly, (but in what Manner is not known) and that he was interred at Adrianople.

St. Ildephonso, August 25. This being her Royal Highness the Princess of Asturias's Name Day, it is kept here as a great Gala, and has been attended, as usual, by a numerous Concourse of the Nobility from Madrid.

Vienna, August 27. His Imperial Majesty is expected here from the Camp at Pest on the last Day of this Month; after which the Court will remove to Laxembourg, where there is likewise to be a Camp.

Munich, September 3. The Harvest is now finished in every Part of this Electorate: The Season has been extremely favourable, and the Crop is said to be the richest that has been seen these many Years.

Offend, September 7. By an Ordinance of the 3d Instant, the Exportation of Wheat and Rye is prohibited by Sea, but the Carriage, by Land towards French Flanders is permitted.

The States of Flanders were desirous to prolong the Term of deepening the Canals between this Place and Ghent to the 10th of next Month; but Government finding the Season too far advanced did not think proper to subject the Navigation to so long an Interruption, and have ordered the Waters to be let into the Canals on the 10th Instant.

St. James's, September 13.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Richard St. George Mansergh, of Macrony in the County of Corke in the Kingdom of Ireland, and his Heirs Male, His Royal Licence and Authority to assume and take the Name of St. George, in Addition to their own Name of Mansergh; and also to order, that this His Majesty's Concession and Declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.
