GEORGE HEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament, which now stands prorogued to Tuesday the Fifteenth Day of November next: We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation; and do hereby dissolve the faid Parliament accordingly. And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting, and Attendance, on Tuescay the said Fisteenth Day of November next. And We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects. Our Royal Will and Pleasure to call a New Parliament: And do hereby further declare, That, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, We have, this Day, given Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain, to issue Our Writs, in due Form, for Calling a New Parliament; which Writs are to bear Teste on Saturday the First Day of October next, and to be returnable on Tuesday the Twenty-ninth Day of November following.

HEREAS We have, in Our Council, thought fit to declare Our Pleasure for Summoning and Holding a Parliament of Great Britain, on Tucfday the Twenty-night Day of November next enfuing the Date hereof: In order therefore to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland, who are to fit in the House of Peers in the faid Parliament; We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, iffue forth this Our Royal Proclama-tion, flicking Charging and Commanding all the Peers of Sectland to affemble and meet at Holy Rood Hense, in Edinburgh, on Tuesday the Fifteenth Day of November next ensuing, between the Hours of Twelve and Two in the Asternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Pcers, to Sit and Vote, in the House of Pcers, in the taid ensuing Parliament, by open Election and Plurality of Voices of the Peers that shall be there present, and of the Proxies of such as shall be absent, (such Proxies being Peers) and producing a Mandate in Writing, duly figured before Witnesses, and both the Constituent and Proxy being qualified according to Law. And the Lord Clerk Register, or such Two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his Name, are hereby respectively required to attend such Meeting, and to administer the Oaths required by Law to be taken there by the faid Peers, and to take their Votes; and immediately, after such Election made.

And We strictly Charge and Command, That this Qur Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and insall the County Towns of Scotland, Twenty-five Days, at least, before the Time hereby appointed for the Meeting of the faid Peers to proceed to fuch Election.
