HER Prussian Majesty came to Town last Tuesday Evening from Shoenhausen for the Winter Season.

St. James's, September 24, 1774.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that in the Night of the 31st of July last, the House erected on Lanberne Downs, in the Parish of Mawgaw in the County of Cornwall, containing the Tools and Implements necessary for carrying on the Mawgaw Porth Canal, was wilfully and maliciously set on Fire and burnt, together with the Timber placed on the Saw-Pit, and several other Pieces of Timber of Oak, Elm, and Balk, lying on the Lands adjoining to the Canal, which were likewise collected together and burnt: His Majesty, for the better discovering and bringing to Justice the Person or Persons concerned in setting Fire to and burning the said House and Timber, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious Pardon to any Person or Persons concerned in setting Fire to and burning the said House and Timber, (except the Person or Persons who actually set Fire to the said House and Timber) who shall discover his, her, or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they, may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
